The fear protects me and I am able to swim for brakettes of time and I won't get angry at myself.

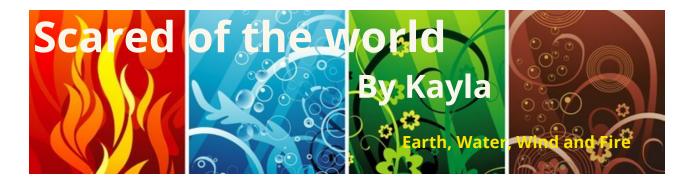
And that is why you need to be aware of your fear before it's too late. Most fears can protect you and that is what mine ended up doing.

"Hmmm wonder what this is?" Mike guestioned himself.

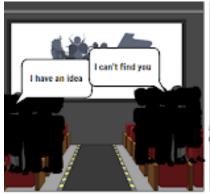

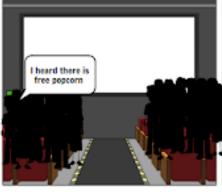

On the very last day of frightful October.





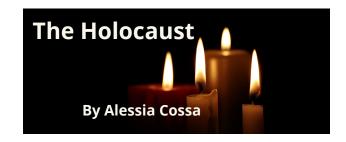


Unicorn poem

What if someone's hurt, we'll need a medic?

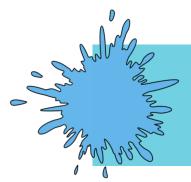
We played a game, I got pushed out of bounds, Now I'm out, there is music all around.

I walked outside and heard a magpie, a pigeon, a possum and a cat.

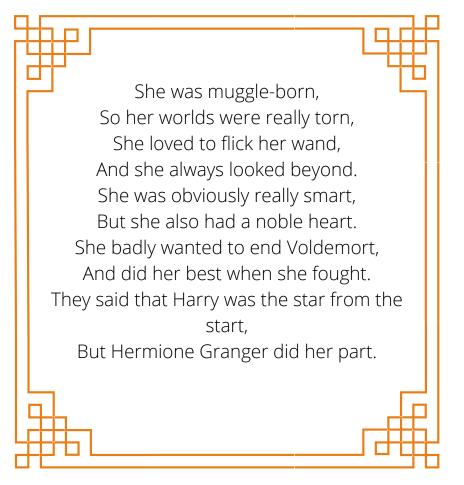
I caught a bus and went home.

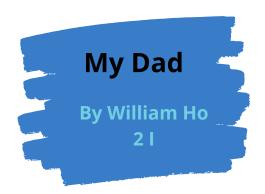

She loves to play many sports, especially her most loved tennis. In the past, she used to play cricket. She played in the WBBL for the Brisbane heat. I am sure there are many more sports she played as a kid. She is a very sporty and inspiring woman. Ash is a proud indigenous woman and loves tennis. She is very talented and is world number one in women's tennis but also is a great influence and role model.

Ash's average day starts with 45 minutes of body preparation work in the morning, which is either stretching or working on the weak areas of her body. Once that is done, Ash then goes out to train for 2 hours. Then she has a bit of lunch and a rest, after that she goes to the gym or does some conditioning, followed by a rehab section. And then sometimes she will sneak back for a second on-court session if Ash needs any extra practice.



Ash Barty is the first Australian indigenous woman to win Wimbledon in 41 years. She has a mum named Josie and her father is Rob, her sisters are Ali and Sara. Some more about Ash is that Barty's mother works as a radiographer and is the daughter of English immigrants. Barty grew up in Springfield, a suburb of Ipswich, Queensland, and attended Woodcrest State College throughout her upbringing.

So many Aussies have beaten many World Records and Olympic Records during the games and have won so many gold medals. Like Ariarne Titmus, the 4x100 women's freestyle relay team, Kaylee McKeown, swimming, women's 4x100m freestyle relay, Emily McKeon 7 time medalist and many more.
