INTRODUCING the 2024 Easter Egg Competition

Dear Trinity students,

You are invited to enter this year's Easter Egg Competition!

The person who most closely guesses the number of chocolate eggs contained in the 3.8 litre jar will win the jar and its entire contents. (See photos below.)

Please see below for Terms & Conditions / Q&A. Wishing you all good fortune and happy guessing!

Terms & Conditions / Q&A:

- 1. Who is eligible to enter? Any student at Trinity Catholic School at the time of the winner announcement date (see condition/question 5 below), with the exception of any student who is also a child of the organiser or of a Trinity staff member.
- 2. Can I play if I don't like or am allergic to chocolate eggs? Yes of course. You can just play for fun and the winner can gift the chocolates to anyone they please. The eggs were purchased recently on Saturday 02/03/2023 and are kept in a cool environment, however, no responsibility will be taken for quality or allergic reactions. (Though we bought some extra eggs and thought they were YUMMO!) Ingredients lists are available on request.
- 3. Are all the eggs the same size/type? No. They are a mix of Ferrero Rocher, Lindt and Red Tulip chocolate eggs, which are all different sizes, but we have not done the common trick of putting a super large egg in the middle.
- 4. How do I submit my guess and can I change my mind? Submit your guess by filling out a piece of paper at Trinity reception with <u>the number</u> you are guessing plus your full name, class and the date then placing it in the relevant box. Submitting a guess constitutes agreement with these Terms & Conditions. You can change your guess but can only submit a maximum of one new guess per day up till <u>3pm on Monday the</u> <u>25th of March</u>. Only your last eligible guess will be taken as the official one. Any guesses that aren't submitted correctly may be deemed invalid. Multiple guesses from one student on any given day will invalidate those guesses.
- 5. Can a parent/adult submit a guess on my behalf? Yes, but these terms and conditions will still apply.
- 6. When will the winner be announced? The winner will be announced at the final assembly of the term which commences at <u>12.30pm on</u> <u>Thursday the 28th of March 2023</u>. The correct number of eggs will also be announced at this time.
- 7. If I win, how do I pick up my prize? The prize will be presented at the assembly at the time of the winner announcement, unless the winner is unavailable at that time, in which case the winner must arrange to pick up the prize from Trinity reception (or get someone to pick it up on your behalf) any day after the Term 1 holidays until the 25th of April (ANZAC day).
- 8. Can I get a close-up look at the jar? Yes, you can view the jar at Trinity reception over the next two weeks <u>from Monday 11 March to Friday</u> <u>22 March 2024</u>. If you are polite, the reception staff might even let you hold the jar (carefully), but you cannot remove the lid. When staff are not at reception, the jar will be secured. Anyone caught tampering with the jar will be disqualified from the competition and might get teased by the Easter Bunny.
- 9. What if there's a tie? The chocolate eggs will be split up and the winners must decide who gets the jar. No argument will be entered into regarding the winning result.
- 10. **Can the organiser or reception staff be bribed to give clues as to the correct number of eggs?** No, but we'll give anyone who has bothered to read this Q&A a free clue: The answer is in the hundreds and there are significantly more than a hundred eggs in the jar.
- 11. Can I ask more questions? Yes, provide the Trinity admin staff with your question and they will forward it on to the organiser (Archie Nhi Hoang on behalf of Trinity and the Dorin/Hoang family).
