

The botanical world holds great fascination for Samantha and inspires much of her painting activity.



Cooking Column

Baked Macaroni in Cheese Sauce

Ingredients

375g macaroni 60g butter 1/3 cup plain flour 2 tsp Dijon mustard 2 ½ cups milk 1 cup (120g) strong cheddar, coarsely grated½ cup breadcrumbs½ cup grated parmesanSalt and pepper

Method



- Preheat oven to moderate 180 C or 160 C if fan forced.
- Cook the macaroni in boiling water following the packet directions. Drain and put aside.
- Melt the butter in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add flour and mustard and stir for two mins. Reduce heat to low and gradually add

the milk stirring constantly for about 5 mins until the sauce boils and thickens. Remove from heat and add the grated cheese and season to taste. Stir to combine. Stir the macaroni into the sauce to combine.


- Spoon into a 2.5 litre oven proof dish.
- Combine the breadcrumbs and the parmesan cheese and sprinkle it over the macaroni mixture.
- Bake for 15 mins or until golden. This is another tried and tested recipe that I have made many times. I make it for the Gardens & Art Festival every year and serve it to visitors to my garden with tea or coffee.
