SPX Yellow were defeated by St Augustine's Gold by 90 runs at well-turned out Nolan's Reserve, in perfect spring conditions.

St Augustine's won the toss and elected to bat. Andrew May and Darcy Mills opened the bowling and restricted the opposition to 14 runs in their combined opening spell of six overs. Both bowled a good length at pace that that made scoring difficult. Andrew May went on to close the innings with a second spell of accurate fast bowling that thwarted the opposition.

Max Lynn, SPX Yellow's left-arm fast bowler "off-season acquisition" and spinner William Zahra were the first change bowlers. Max challenged the opposition with pace and bounce and William was unlucky not to collect a wicket with Darcy Aylmer just falling short of making a brilliant diving catch at deep mid-wicket.

Tom Carroll and Max Spurr each collected a wicket, with Max combining his bowling and wicket-keeping skills in a caught-and-bowled dismissal. Tom was rewarded for his persistence with a well-taken catch at square leg by Finn Mansbridge, another "off-season acquisition" who asked plenty of questions of St Augustine's with his medium pace bowling, following his tidy wicket-keeping performance.

William Lyall was stoic in his bowling, as the opposition accelerated its run-rate late in the innings. He was supported by captain Darcy Aylmer's spin at the other end and a muchimproved Chris Mander, whose "lock-down" net sessions paid dividends. He showed great promise and will take wickets bowling a longer length. St Augustine's closed its innings at 4-124.

William Lyall and Chris Mander opened SPX Yellow's run chase and encountered some very accurate good-length bowling by the opposition. William was beginning to make some good stroke-play when he fell to an "unplayable" in swinging yorker, that removed two of his stumps. Chris was the next batsman to fall to a very good rising delivery that he edged to the wicketkeeper.

Darcy Alymer and Finn Mansbridge steadied the innings and went about building a partnership. The going was tough, with both batsmen having difficulty penetrating the covers. Darcy broke through on the on-side with good pull shot but fell in the next delivery to a ball that clipped his off-stump bail.

Nathan Bund joined Finn only briefly, as he was dismissed by an exceptional catch and was very unlucky. The prospect of a partnership between Finn and Max Spurr started to materialize, until Finn was dismissed and unable to "cash in" on all his hard work at the crease.

Tom Carroll supported Max as he got off the mark and started scoring some runs. However, a quick succession of wickets with Max, Tom and Max Lynn falling with only four runs added to SPX Yellow's total, placed any hope of a victory out of reach.

Undaunted by the prospect of defeat, Andrew May found a way to score against some very good bowling, by playing some good straight drives. He was supported by Darcy Mills, until he was bowled by a good delivery. His feats with the ball and bat earned him the man of the match award for SPX Yellow. The innings closed, all out for 34 when William Zahra was stumped.

Despite the loss, the team demonstrated great promise for the season ahead. Its strength is its bowling and fielding, which will keep it "in the hunt for victories" while it develops its batting capabilities.
