Our Grade 3 NAPLAN results show strong achievement across all assessment areas, with the majority of Brighton Primary School students performing in the *Strong* and *Exceeding* proficiency bands. Compared to both network and similar schools, our **students performed particularly well in Writing** (97%), well above other schools. Numeracy and Spelling results were also above those of network and similar schools. While Reading was slightly below network and similar school results, they still represent high levels of achievement.



The Grade 5 NAPLAN results for Brighton Primary School show a consistently strong performance across all assessment areas. Compared with both our network schools and similar schools, our students achieved higher levels of proficiency in every domain. In particular, our **Numeracy results were excellent**, with 91% of students performing in the Strong and Exceeding categories—5% above the network and 4% above similar schools. Strong results were also evident in Writing, Grammar & Punctuation, Reading, and Spelling, reflecting the continued **impact of our evidence-based teaching practices** and the hard work of our students and staff.

## **Grade 6 Cohort 2025**

The graph below, shared recently by our network, shows the relative growth in reading from Grade 3 in 2022 to Grade 5 in 2024 across all Beachside primary schools. We're proud to share that Brighton Primary School's **current Grade 6 cohort** achieved the highest levels of relative growth for reading. This means that, compared to students with similar starting points in Grade 3, our students made significantly greater progress in reading by the time they reached Grade 5.

## **Progressive Achievement Test**

Lastly, Brighton Primary School is also conducting the <u>Progressive Achievement Tests</u> (PAT) in both reading and numeracy for a second year. All students in Grades 1 - 6 complete the reading & numeracy assessment three times a year in Terms 1, 2, and 4. Like NAPLAN, the PAT assessments provide your child's achievement level in the context of their year group nationally. Below are the average cohort scale scores for Term 1 compared with the Victorian Average.
