YEAR 12 STUDENTS

VTAC APPLICATIONS - Don't forget to make a VTAC course application if you plan to study next year. Applications are now open, and close for timely applicants on 30
 September (cost \$29.00). If you apply after this date the cost rises considerably. Remember that you can change your application as many times as you wish at no extra charge, so you don't have to get it 'right' the first time you apply. See: www.vtac.edu.au. You will need to register as an applicant first; after that you can apply using the ID number VTAC supplies you with when you register. Also apply even if you plan to take a year off (gap year) from study in 2016. You are able to defer taking up the offer of your place for a year in many cases. You can apply for up to 12 courses, placing them in the order you most want them. You will be offered a place in the highest course in your list for which you meet the requirements (ATAR).

• NOTE: If you wish to apply for some Fine Arts specializations at the University of Melbourne (VCA), applications close early (28 August). These specializations are: animation, dance, film and television and screenwriting.

• SPECIAL ENTRY ACCESS SCHEMES (SEAS)

Many institutions offer alternative entry schemes that take into account short and longterm disadvantage. **The Special Entry Access Schemes (SEAS)** allow selection officers to grant special consideration for course entry to applicants (you must still complete any selection requirements for the course). These are the four SEAS categories:

- Personal information and location (all applicants are encouraged to apply for this Category as something in this category may apply to you)
- ✓ Difficult circumstances
- ✓ Disadvantaged financial background
- ✓ Disability or medical condition

NOTE: It is only possible to **complete a SEAS application** once you have **completed a VTAC course application**. There is a summary of institutions accepting SEAS categories on page 42 of the VTAC Guide. In many cases you will have to provide **suitable evidence** for your application for SEAS. The emphasis is on **how you believe the matter you refer to in your SEAS application affected your results**.

Tertiary Scholarships

Many scholarships for higher education can be applied for directly on the VTAC website or as part of your VTAC application. There are many different types of scholarships, for example those based on ATAR or access and equity.

You need to submit an application prior to 28 February in the year you undertake Year 12. However, you are encouraged to apply in Year 11.

Work Experience at Zoos Victoria



Secondary school work experience can be an extremely valuable experience for young people. Zoos Victoria has developed a secondary school work experience program to inspire the next generation of youth to be inspired to work with wildlife.

Each year, Zoos Victoria selects a limited number students as part of their work experience program to gain experience at one of Victoria's three zoos; Healesville Sanctuary, Melbourne Zoo or Werribee Open Range Zoo.

Although the programs are slightly different at each property, we hope that all students finish the week with a deeper appreciation for wildlife and the environment we share with them.

The program is all-weather, full day work program (start and finish times vary per property). Successful students will be required to perform physically demanding manual labour duties under supervision.

Zoos Victoria accepts applications one year in advance from interested secondary students. To apply for a 2016 placement, please follow the selection process steps outlined below:

How to apply?

- Students must choose one property to complete their work experience placement (Note: students can only apply for one zoo property: Healesville Sanctuary, Melbourne Zoo or Werribee Open Range Zoo).
- Students must write a cover letter detailing how they meet the criteria listed in the property role description
- The application is then submitted to the zoo via the school's Work Experience Coordinator by completing an online application (Note: applications submitted from students directly to the zoo will not be considered).

Who is eligible?

Victorian secondary students aged over 15 years are eligible for the program.

School Careers Coordinators can only endorse one student per school.

Online applications for the 2016 Secondary School Work Experience placements will be open from **Monday 24 August 2015** until close of business **Friday 18 September 2015**.

Only applications submitted between these dates will be accepted.
