Bachelor of Accident Forensics at CQ University

The **Accident Forensics** degree at CQU (Melbourne Campus) *develops expertise in the investigation and analysis of the factors which lead to accidents and the interventions required to prevent their recurrence. Accident Forensics graduates demonstrate advanced skills at systematically breaking down the factors leading to an accident and making the necessary findings and conclusions for prevention.*

The course provides core studies in:

- Accident Phenomenology
- Investigation Methods
- Forensic Engineering
- Accident Analysis
- Human Factors Investigation
- Occupational Health and Safety

Students complete a capstone accident investigation project based on a 'real' accident reconstruction at the university 'crash lab'. There is a 120-hour work placement with practising accident investigators in the field ensuring students are well prepared to integrate into their chosen career. The course has been developed in consultation with Australia's leading accident investigation professionals from air, rail, road and industrial contexts, and the leading organisations and government authorities which inform public safety strategies.

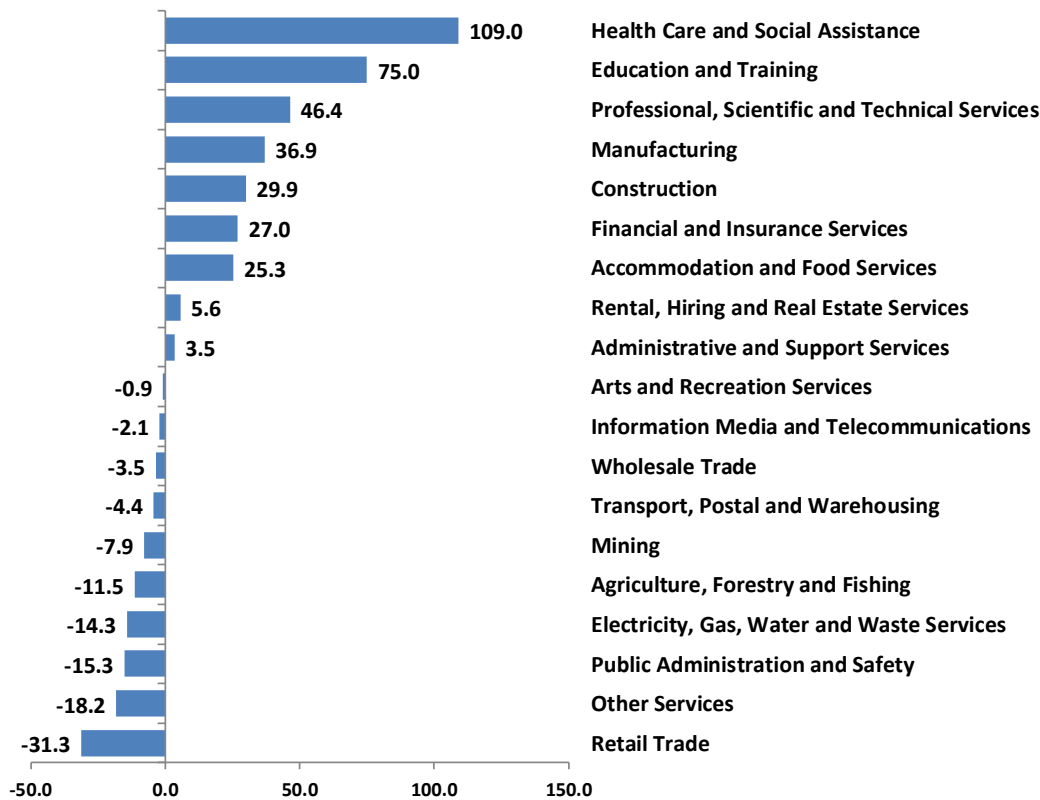


Industry Employment Summary

In February this year, the Department of Employment released the trend in employment indicating that employment increased in nine industries and declined in 10 over the year to **February 2020**.

Health Care and Social Assistance; Education and Training and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services made the largest contributions to employment growth. The largest falls in employment were recorded in Retail Trade, Other Services and Public Administration and Safety.

Employment in the **Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing** and **Manufacturing** industries is expected to continue to fall.

Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Business: Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Business stream students can apply to enter into the second year of the Bachelor of Business Administration (Peninsula) OR the Bachelor of Business (Caulfield) depending upon their mathematics preparation, and their average marks in the DoTS program.

Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Education: Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Education stream students can apply to enter into the second year of the Bachelor of Education (Honours) in several specialisations.

Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Nursing: Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Nursing stream students can apply to enter into the second year of the Bachelor of Nursing.
