# A Star Education

Star of the Sea College offers a broad, challenging and progressive academic program. Religious Education is an integral part of the curriculum across all year levels. Through all aspects of Religious Education we seek to affirm the dignity and worth of each individual. Students are encouraged to be active in practising their faith and take responsibility for their lives and the world in which they live.

In the first two years of their secondary education, students have the opportunity to experience a range of subjects as outlined in The Victorian Curriculum F-10. They are introduced to three Language studies, German, Italian and Japanese, and will maintain at least one of these until the completion of Year 9. Mixed ability classes ensure that each student has the opportunity to reach their potential through a curriculum that is sufficiently differentiated to cater for the needs of each individual. A wide selection of elective subjects offered at Years 9 and 10 allows students to specialise in particular areas of interest and expertise. Along with the continuation of core subject areas: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Health and Physical Education, students are encouraged to develop their strengths and interests and maintain breadth through Design & Technology and the visual and performing arts.

A Careers Leader is available to assist Years 9 to 12 students in

choosing subjects appropriate to strengths, interests and aspirations. Star offers a VCE program that caters for a wide range of interests and abilities and includes a number of programs that allow students to follow different academic pathways including an Applied Learning Pathway (Vocational Major and VET Studies). The learning spaces for senior classes have been specifically designed to replicate a tertiary environment, preparing our students for future endeavours.

#### **Co-Curricular Activities**



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## Faith, Family and Friends

The wellbeing of students permeates the fabric of education at Star of the Sea College. It is embedded in the spirit of the gospels and the mission of Kildare Ministries through justice, compassion and action. Wellbeing encompasses the partnership of student, parent and College and every opportunity is taken to foster this partnership. The quality of the relationship between all members of the school community characterises Star as a Catholic College. A culture of openness, compassion, tolerance, forgiveness and reconciliation is engendered within the College community.

The emphasis on self respect means respect for others' rights, safety and happiness. Leadership skills are encouraged through the Mentor group, year level and House programs.

Student wellbeing is the immediate concern of the Mentor teachers, who are the first contact point for parents to communicate with the College. At Year 7 to Year 9 the Mentor groups are arranged in year level cohorts. For Years 10 to 12, Mentor groups are vertical. The Pastoral Leader supports the Mentor teacher. Counselling support is offered to students and parents. The College also offers a wide range of curricular and co-curricular Pastoral programs to augment the wellbeing of students. 'Each student is nurtured, cherished and challenged through the Wellbeing program. Every student is encouraged to value themselves, to develop a sense of belonging and to be secure in their engagement with the world.'



# Living Justice

Some of the outreach opportunities offered to Star of the Sea College students are the commitment to Little Mission, a local charity supporting low income families and the Friday Night Tutoring program held each week in Richmond. Star supports Wellsprings for Women, the Brigidine Asylum Seekers Program (BASP) and engages in a wide range of environmental activities including 'Clean Up Australia Day', 'Earth Hour', tree planting, beach cleanups, an annual 'Environment Week', the maintenance of a kitchen garden, recycling facilities and the installation of solar panels and water tanks.

There is student participation in a multitude of justice-related conferences and justice topics are studied across the curriculum in all subject areas.

Annual fundraising and goods collection for the Caritas 'Project Compassion' campaign, Sacred Heart Mission, St Vincent de Paul conference, and various Presentation Sisters' projects are other areas where Star students actively support others. Sport, Health and Physical Education at Star of the Sea College work closely together to provide students with a very challenging and comprehensive program. During all Physical Education classes, students are encouraged to participate fully to explore and realise their potential. Physical Education classes provide students with the opportunity to experience a wide range of traditional and recreational sports, as well as new developments and trends in the sporting world.

Through our involvement with Girls' Sport Victoria, students have the opportunity to represent their school in 15 different sports. The emphasis is on commitment, organisation and doing one's best.

Star has a strong tradition of fostering creativity in visual art, music, drama and dance. Performances in drama, music and dance are an important feature of the life of the school. One highlight every year is the House competition `Music Festival', which is completely student led and performed at The Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre.

The opportunities for students to develop their talents extend from music-making, acting and dancing to areas of stagecraft, set design, lighting, costuming and stage management. The senior student production is a highlight each year, allowing further development and learning in the arts. Star's award winning acapella group 'Stacella' showcases a variety of musical styles and provides an avenue for students across the school to sing together, which has been shown to have positive wellbeing outcomes.

The FayByrne Centre is a Performing Arts space dedicated to providing a variety of performance spaces for theatre studies, drama and music.

The Visual Arts curriculum offers students the opportunity to work in a wide range of media. Emphasis is placed on encouraging students to be imaginative, confident and skilful in discussing and producing art works. The annual Art and Design Show showcases the abundant talent amongst our students and their work is regularly featured in the VCAA Top Arts and Top Designs seasons of excellence.





Kamesburgh House provides the backdrop for Year 9 Star of the Sea College students and offers a unique learning and teaching program to prepare them for their future in the world. As students enter Year 9, they become increasingly aware of the world around them, and more complex in their thinking.

We foster in our Year 9 students the self-confidence they need to reflect and strive for excellence in their endeavours. We encourage Year 9 students to problem solve, become independent in their decision-making and form authentic relationships. We provide an environment in which learning is a journey taken together as students, teachers, families and the wider community.

As part of the curriculum, Endeavour is a specialised subject with a focus on entrepreneurial skills, critical and creative thinking, ethics, inter cultural studies, and personal and social skills. Throughout the year, students will collaborate and communicate, engage with and solve problems in a real-world context. Enterprise skills are seen as vital for future employment and the Endeavour program provides an opportunity for the development of skills and competencies that are seen as vital for success in the future. The extensive Exploration program is embedded into the Year 9 curriculum, allowing students to see how their subjects link with their experiences in the world around them. Through this, they develop a deeper understanding of their own place in the world.
