Food scientists are responsible for

- Making food tastier, healthier, and safer for people
- Inventing new foods and flavours and studying how consumers like them
- Studying how packaging preserves food after it has been processed
- Sustainable agricultural food processing
- Influencing people's eating behaviours so they are more healthy
- Improving the health of people by influencing what they eat through marketing.

Victoria Tertiary Admission Centre (VTAC) dates

- Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS): closed.
- Applications: students can still register for a VTAC account and apply for courses.
 Applications made before Friday 3 November, 5pm, will cost \$103.00 and applications made between Friday 3 November, 5pm – Friday 8 December, 5pm, will cost \$134.00.
- Scholarships: The Scholarship application must be submitted online by Monday 16 October, 12 noon. Supporting documentation (if applicable) must be received by VTAC either online or via post by this time.
- Payment: The registration fee must be paid by Wednesday 1 November to be considered for early offers or by Monday 18 December for main round offers.
- Personal Statement: Due by Friday 8
 December. Only relevant for some courses.
- Change of Preference: applicants won't be able to change their preferences between Saturday 4 November – Sunday 19 November.
- **Finalising preferences**: Preferences for main round offers must be finalised by Wednesday 20 December, 12 noon.
- Offers: Round 1 offers will be released 16
 January. From there you will be able to change your preferences for future rounds.

News from Monash University

2018 Monash Access Mentors: Applications for the Monash Access Mentors program are now open for high achieving Year 12 students who plan to study at Monash in 2018. Becoming a Mentor is a fantastic opportunity for students to develop their leadership, public speaking and teamwork skills, and participate in leadership and networking opportunities with senior Monash staff and alumni.

Mentors are considered for the Community Leaders Scholarship, available for one year. The opportunity is open to domestic students with an ATAR of 85+. Interested students must apply to become an Access Monash Mentor. Applications close: Tuesday 31 October 2017, http://bit.ly/2kEjcql

Monash Indigenous Entry Scheme: The Indigenous entry scheme provides access for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants into a range of Monash courses with a significantly lower ATAR requirement. All Indigenous undergraduate students are supported through programs coordinated by the Yulendj Indigenous Engagement Unit. Valued at up to \$12,000 per year, this support includes access to one-on-one academic tutoring, the supply of prescribed textbooks and a Monash Sport gym membership.

Students studying through the Faculty of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences can also access support for accommodation and course costs, as well as gaining access to a vertical peer support program. For information and how to apply for the Indigenous Entry Scheme, go to http://bit.ly/2kDZ7Rd

Monash Maths Bridging course: this program is available to domestic students who narrowly miss the required study score in the mathematics prerequisite subjects for a Monash Engineering, Science or Business and Economics undergraduate degree. Students will undertake face-to-face study for 16 days. Eligibility – VCE Students who receive a study score of 20-24 in VCE Mathematical Methods Units 3 and 4.
