Medical Conditions Policy: Any child that is diagnosed with a medical condition such as asthma, epilepsy, anaphylaxis etc. must supply a medical action plan to the OSHC service prior to the child commencing at the service. The Educational and Care Regulations require all children's services have these documents in place before the child attends to ensure that staff are aware of how to appropriately care for the child and their medical needs. Parents are required to supply a medical action plan that has been completed by a doctor no more than 12 months old. If any prescribed medication is noted on the medical plan, this must also be provided to the service prior to the child commencing at the program. The medication needs to be provided in its original packaging with the child's name and dosage required clearly stated. Once the plan has been provided, the Educational Leader, Rebekah, will contact the family to ensure that a risk minimisation plan is completed which seeks to minimise any risks associated with the child's medical condition.
