

There is a Self-Assessment Audit Tool which students can use to help to make career decisions.



Landscape Architects plan and design land areas for projects such as open space networks, parks, schools, institutions, roads, external areas for all building types, land subdivisions, and commercial, industrial and residential sites.

You usually need a bachelor's degree in landscape architecture to work as a Landscape Architect. In some states, training may also be available through VET (Vocational Education and Training).

Landscape Architects earn an average of about \$1674.00 per week

Getting the most out of an Open Day

Most institutional Open Days are held in late July and August (see above page for Open Day dates). However, you are more than welcome to contact an institution to arrange a visit any time.

What happens on an Open Day?

On Open Day you can visit an institution when it's at its best. Everyone is there – academics, lecturers, current students and information officers. More importantly, you can talk with academics, lecturers and current students about what certain courses are actually like, and what is required to get into them.

Who should attend an Open Day?

Anyone who is considering studying at a tertiary level in the next few years should attend.

Why should you attend an Open Day?

Apart from the opportunity to obtain course information there are many other reasons why attending an Open Day is a good idea:

- You are going to feel more comfortable arriving at a university or TAFE institute on the first day of classes if you have been there before.
- What is really involved in the course or courses you are interested in?
- If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?
- Will you be happier studying in a large metropolitan institution or a smaller, perhaps rural institution?
- What does the place 'feel' like? Is it a bustling environment with lots of activity or a quieter, more relaxed campus set in landscaped grounds?
- How are you going to get there? Is it close to public transport or should you start saving now for a car?

If you don't know the answers to any of these questions, then you should attend an Open Day!

How to make the best of Open Days?

To make your Open Day visits fun and informative, here are some pointers:

- Write down a list of questions you would like to ask about particular courses
- Be there early. Crowds tend to develop as the day progresses
- On arrival, get a map from a central point and ask for directions to the relevant faculties or schools
- Ask questions!
- Don't spend the day collecting printed information only. Use the opportunity to speak directly with academics before applications close
- Introduce yourself to selection officers if you feel it is appropriate, but don't be pushy

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- Check out the residential colleges, if available. After all, it is you that will be living there.
- Walk around the campus. Have a good look! See what sporting facilities and other services are available.
- Enjoy the visit!

Selecting Subjects for an Australian Apprenticeship or Traineeship

As we get into the second half of 2019, students will begin to make decisions about their future; and decisions about what subjects to take on in years 10, 11 and 12.

Deciding what subjects to select in the finals years of school can feel like a tough assignment, which is why it is important to consider a few things before submitting preferences.

Firstly, consider what it is you would like to take on once school has finished, and consider what type of career you would like to pursue.

Different jobs require different skills, so try doing some research into the type of work you're interested in and see if it sounds like something you would be comfortable taking on.

A great place to start doing this research is the 'Find My Work Type' section of the AAPathways website. You can access these resources here: <u>www.aapathways.com.au/career-research/interest-explorer-page</u>

For many students, the next step from high school will be straight into University. For many others, the next step will be into an Australian Apprenticeship or Traineeship.

For those looking to go to university, subject selection can be easily laid out. On the flip side, for students thinking about an apprenticeship or traineeship, subject selection may not be as obvious.

It is important to consider how the subjects you choose might help you in your life after school.

If you are thinking of doing an apprenticeship or traineeship, it is still important to choose subjects that can be applied in the trade or industry of your choice.

To help make these decisions, you should try to think about what skills are needed to succeed in your apprenticeship or traineeship.

For example; to succeed as an electrician it is important to have a good understanding of numbers and equations. So, you should aim to select subjects that a closely related to maths.

When selecting subjects, it is important to think of how you can apply your learning to life after school. Try to keep this in mind!

Historically we have understood the Viking Age as beginning with the devastation of Lindisfarne Abbey by the furious Northmen and ending with three Viking kings fighting each other for control of England – more mutually assured destruction than a meeting of the minds. But was this image of blond-haired berserk barbarians rampaging across the UK and Europe a reality, or is what the medieval chroniclers called the *Mare Barbarum*, the Barbarian Sea, an artefact of history?
