

YEAR 10 IMPORTANT INFORMATION – TERM 4 PROGRAMS 2020

Dear Parent/Carer

I would like to inform you of important information regarding the completion of your daughter's Record of School Achievement (RoSA), and other significant programs your daughter will be undertaking during Term 4, 2020:

WEEKS 1-4, Term 4 ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

- As part of the RoSA credential, all students in Year 10 receive a grade from the school across all subjects. These grades are the result of an assessment program undertaken throughout the year. Your daughter must have completed this assessment program and met RoSA requirements to receive a grade. **Final class assessments are taking place during Weeks 1 to 4 of Term 4. This includes examinations, which in 2020 will be held in class during weeks 3-4.**
- For the award of their RoSA, all Year 10 students must complete **examinations held at school, IN CLASS TIMES, in Weeks 3-4, Term 4, October 26th - November 6th.** Faculties will notify students of examination times and requirements.

Students must attend school as normal for weeks 1-4 of term 4 to complete final assessments and examinations. Any absence affecting submission of an assessment task or completion of a task or examination will require an illness/Misadventure application. - **All my Own Work Program (AMOW)** which is mandatory for all students who will return to study in Year 11, 2021.
- **Work Ready** Program (Careers, VET in preparation for work placement)
- Re testing for students needing to meet **Minimum Standards** in Literacy and Numeracy testing
- **Sign Out & Year 10 Clearance** formalities –
All students must be present to return any items that belong to the school e.g. textbooks, library books etc.. Students not returning to take up study in Year 11, 2021 must apply to the Year Advisers Ms Jones/Ms Reed to receive a school reference on this day.
- **Rehearsal** for Recognition in week 10

WEEK 10 December 14th – 16th

- The school's **RECOGNITION DAY CEREMONY** will be held on Monday December 14th. Format and details for 2020 are to be confirmed. This will involve Year 10 students receiving their annual prizes. Students are expected to be in full school uniform for this ceremony. Students will receive their yearly report after the Ceremony.
- On **Tuesday December 15th** an End of Year picnic to celebrate students' successful completion of junior high school will be held. A separate Parent Information and Permission Note will be issued. Again, the 2020 format and details are to be confirmed.
- On Wednesday December 16th the school is open and students will undertake an alternative program to timetabled lessons.

The school would ask that at the conclusion of the year, families consider donating any junior uniform items which can be used to support students in need.
