Female freshwater crocodiles lay up to 20 eggs in a hole in a sandy riverbank Female saltwater crocodiles build a nest on a riverbank or swamp and can lay up to 50 eggs in a nest.

Diet

Both types eat fish and other reptiles but also large male saltwater eat water buffalo
