

PROGRAM ENROLMENT 2025

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We have had a highly successful year in the Instrumental Music Program at Vermont Secondary College, and we are extremely excited to move forward into 2025. We are now starting to plan for next years' program and to ensure a place next year we will need this form completed and returned by Monday 3rd February 2025.

Please note that participation in the program is optional but it is a full year commitment.

Ensembles

Participation in an ensemble is a compulsory component of the Instrumental Music Program. These ensembles take place outside the normal class time (before school, after school and lunchtimes). Students are expected to regularly attend their allocated ensemble. Students will be allocated to an ensemble based on their instrument and level of experience.

Costs

- Students taking instrumental or singing lessons at the college are required to pay an Instrumental Music Levy, see below)
- Some students choose to learn two instruments within the school program. Please discuss the option of learning two instruments with Khristian Mizzi in the Music Department.
- Percussion/Drum students are asked to buy sticks, a practice pad and a book
- Students may be asked to purchase a music book or display folder to use in lessons. Individual teachers will let students know if this is the case.
- There is a levy for students participating in ensembles but not taking lessons.

Instrumental Music Levies for 2025

Instrumental Music Levy (including voice) \$575 per year (or \$143.75 per term)
Second Instrument Levy \$285 per year (or \$71.25 per term)
VCE Instrumental Levy \$695 per year (or \$173.75 per term)
Instrument Hire Levy \$250 per year (or \$62.50 per term)
Ensemble Only Fee \$145 per year (or \$36.25 per term)

All payments can be made via Compass Events. There is also an option to create a payment plan.

Instruments

Any student-owned instrument MUST be clearly labelled with the student's name before being brought to school. Instruments are to be kept in the music storeroom during school hours (not in lockers or the student manager's office).

Lessons

Each student enrolled in our program will receive one instrumental lesson in a small group (1-4 students) for 35 minutes. This will be held during class time and will be reflected each week on their compass schedule. Included in this commitment is the students' enrolment in at least one band/ensemble/choir.

Instruments for Hire

As you are aware, a variety of instruments may be hired from the college. (Guitars and drums are not available for hire). A hire form must be returned before instruments are taken home for the holidays. Many students may look at buying their own instruments, particularly if they wish to learn flute, clarinet, or saxophone. Some music stores offer hire purchase schemes and buying a used instrument is also worth consideration. The instrumental teachers will be happy to give advice concerning the purchase of an appropriate instrument. Please avoid purchasing instruments from supermarkets.

Parent/Teacher Communication

Teachers are happy to discuss your child's progress. Feel free to contact the specific teacher via email and if needed arrange a time to peak over the phone.

 To meet all associated levies and charges. I understand that failure to do so will result in lessons being suspended or cancelled.
 To meet any additional costs incurred by students participating in the program.
• The student MUST attend all scheduled lessons, ensemble rehearsals and performances. Any absences should be communicated via email or a note to the music department.
• Students may have the opportunity to arrange make-up lessons for any that are missed due to other school activities. This will depend on time and teacher availability.
• There will be NO refunds given for students who choose to leave the program during the term.
(Special circumstances may be considered but any request is subject to approval by College Council).
• The student/parents/guardians MUST provide, in writing, four (4) weeks' notice prior to the commencement of the term, of any withdrawal from the program.
 The student/parents/guardians MUST provide in writing reasons for any absences from scheduled lessons, ensemble rehearsals and performances.
 The student/parents/guardians will pay for any wilful damage or loss of instruments hired from the College when in the students' possession.
