This is an opportunity to meet with current students who've moved from around Australia to learn about their experience and find out how they managed the transition.


Attendees will be treated to lunch, as well as a personal tour of our beautiful Parkville campus and a residential college.

NEW SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS FROM MILDURA OR MURRY PLAINS DISTRICTS

The generous, Sisson Family Scholarship was gifted by Edith and Andrew Sisson and offers one student from Mildura or the Murray Plains Districts a total scholarship of \$97,000.

Benefits:

- Full accommodation allowance for a standard bedroom at Little Hall
- Living allowance of \$4,000 per year, paid in half-yearly instalments for three years
- One off travel allowance of \$4,000 towards overseas study as part of your undergraduate degree.

Eligibility:

- Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident, or a New Zealand citizen
- Reside in, and completing Year 12 at a government school in, the Mildura and Murray Plains Districts in Victoria
- Intend to apply for the Bachelor of Biomedicine or Bachelor
 of Science under <u>Access Melbourne</u> via <u>VTAC Special Entry</u>
 <u>Access Scheme (SEAS)</u> for commencement in the year following
 completion of Year 12.

Application dates: 3 May - 31 August 2021

Shortlisted and unsuccessful candidates will be notified by the end of September. The final scholarship offer will be made in December after the release of ATAR results.

The following has been taken from a piece by Executive Director and Academic Registrar, Student and Scholarly Services, Joanne Ligouris, sent to all staff informing them of Wendy's retirement.

"Over the course of her career, Wendy has been at the forefront of the University's student recruitment efforts. She has led many initiatives, including the introduction of interstate visits over more than 20 years ago and supporting the launch of the *Melbourne Scholarships* and the initial *Kwong Lee Dow Young Scholars* program as part of the Melbourne Model implementation. She has also been a driving force in the annual School Principals' Dinner.

"Throughout her time at the University, Wendy has had a passion for attracting equity and regional students to Melbourne, most recently through her advocacy of the Principals' Scholarships building upon the earlier Access Melbourne program, fulfilling an institutional objective and her personal commitment to equity, access and fairness. In recognition of these achievements, Wendy and team were awarded the 2012 Diversity and Inclusion Award in recognition of these efforts and this sits alongside Wendy's Universitas 21 Scholarship as major career awards.
