


- We ask that all students arrive at school by 8.40 so that they have time to set up their desk, put their diary out, and be ready for learning at 8:45.
- If picking up or dropping off your child during class time please sign them in/out at the office. A staff member will call their classroom to make their way up to the office.
- Students with BYOD iPads are to bring them to school every day with at least 50% charge.

- A reminder that supervision time starts at 8.35.
- If you are parked on the other side of the car park, please ensure your child crosses the road safely. We also remind you that the car park is on a major arterial road and that parking in the left hand turning lane puts everyone's safety at risk.
- Assemblies are now held each fortnight at 2:30pm on a Friday, a teacher will contact you on Wednesday or before, if your child is receiving a Principal's award.

LITERACY

This year, we embark on a revised Literacy structure to support the development key literacy skills. This will look and feel a little different from the structure we have previously used at Ceres PS. The new structure aligns with key Department initiatives to improve Literacy skills of students in Victoria. Please see below the daily instructional model of our Literacy program:



READING JOURNAL

We have transitioned from a student diary to a Resilience Project Reading Journal. We encourage all students to have one of these, which can be purchased from the office. A reading journal allows students to record their nightly reading, which will be incentivised through house tokens for reaching increments of 25 reading night milestones. The journals offer wellbeing resources which align to our school practices and help create a shared understanding of positive wellbeing strategies between home and school and in turn will help enhance happiness and resilience in and out of the classroom.



SMART SPELLING

During the first two days of this term, staff undertook professional development of the SMART Spelling program. SMART Spelling is an explicit and systematics approach to teaching spelling, which will be implemented from Foundation to Year 6. Students will focus on a list of words each week, with 80% of the words belonging to a particular sound-letter relationship. 20% of the words will come from the students' own writing and they are called 'BOB' words. Within the Literacy program, we explicitly teach spelling patterns and rules

aligned to a scope and sequence. Weekly word lists will be shared with families on SeeSaw for opportunities to practice them at home (optional).



INQUIRY



For the first half of Inquiry, we will be focusing on 'Leadership' as our Inquiry topic. This will allow Year 6 School Leaders, Year 5 JSC Leaders an opportunity to explore their roles and responsibilities. For our Year 4 students, they will work on developing their JSC speeches and or working towards a community project. This will align with the 'Personal and Social Capabilities' within the curriculum. We will also explore 'Civics and Citizenship' and learn about democracy in Australia, the importance of rules and laws and how they are established through Parliament.





NUMERACY

In Maths this term, the Grade 4/5/6s are consolidating and extending their skills and understandings of place value, to include decimals and fractions, focusing on developing their fluency and confidence in partitioning, renaming and ordering decimals and fractions, as well as estimation and rounding.

Lessons will follow our regular lesson model of Warm up, Explicit Teaching, Independent Work/ Clinic and Reflection (though this sometimes occurs throughout the lesson), with a Challenging Maths Task implemented at least once per week, following our 'Launch/ Explore/ Discuss' model.


Students being able to regularly practise recall of multiplication facts up to 10 x 10 will greatly assist in solving more complex problems, there are many great resources to practise this recall (songs, Mathletics live, MyNumeracy games) that your child can use at home. Students can also access their Maths learning goals through Seesaw. These will guide their work in class, but will also align with MyNumeracy activities that they can access while at home.

VALUES

Did you know that we have revised our school Values? We now have the 3R's: Respect, Resilience and Responsibility. These core values are entrenched in our school and follow our 'Positive Behaviour Matrix' (please see

below). Throughout our weekly Values

lessons, we will teach the Values, along with the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships Curriculum. Through this, we will explore the topic of Emotional Literacy. We wil also be incorporating the 'Resilience Project' into our Wellbeing curriculum again this year. Each student will receive their own 'Resilience Project' journal to practise and promote positive mental health strategies to build resilience.
