- You can find red pandas in a few different countries. here are where they live:
- Nepal, India, Bhutan, Myanmar, and China
- Red pandas usually inhabit temperate broadleaf forests with bamboo understories at altitudes between 2400 and 3900 meters, primarily in the Eastern Himalayas. Females construct nests in tree hollows, tree roots, or bamboo thickets, lining them with materials like moss and leaves. Cubs remain in these nests for the first few months of their lives.

Diet



- What do red pandas eat? Red pandas mainly feed on leaves and bamboo, but occasionally snack on fruit, insects, bird eggs and small lizards.
- Baby red pandas eat a diet consisting of bamboo. They start chewing on bamboo twigs in the den around 40-50 days old, but they don't regularly eat solid food until they are four months old. At 6-8 months, they are fully weaned. While bamboo is the main food source, they also may consume other items like insects, eggs, and small mammals in the wild.



Predators



- The primary predator of the red panda is thought to be the snow leopard and sometimes martens.
- Baby red pandas, like their adults, are primarily prey for snow leopards and martens. Other potential predators include birds of prey and small carnivores, with the snow leopard being a major concern.

Baby red pandas typically stay with their mother for about a year, or until they are fully grown. They become mature around 18 months of age.





FUN FACT!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

They have a false thumb (an extended wrist bone) which has developed over time to help them climb trees and eat bamboo.









Red pandas typically live 8-10 years in the wild and up to and up to 15 years in captivity
