Student Representative Council Role Description

Students participating in the Student Representative Council act as a voice on behalf of the student body and have opportunities to speak as a representative on behalf of the College. This may include suggested improvements, the support of whole and part school initiatives and representing the image and interests of the College in the wider community.

Some of the initiatives you may be involved in include:

- Holding informal and formal meetings to discuss issues of concern and College improvement.
- Participating and supporting College events and activities as a collective.
- Providing extracurricular College activities to enhance school spirit.
- Fundraising for both College benefit and community initiatives.
- Send College representatives to regional and state leadership initiatives.
- Provide leadership opportunities for youth in a whole school context.
- Support College assemblies and programs that run within the College.
- Participate in minor ceremonial and informative tasks as required. (Flags, Signs & Speaking)

The role of an SRC member includes a willingness to participate in many of the above activities. This responsibility is shared to minimise disruption to learning but allows opportunities individuals to be challenged.

SRC nominations will be shortlisted by the Leadership Team and House Leaders as well as taking into consideration teacher recommendations.
