Wednesday 20 to Friday 22 February 2019

This note provides you with an itinerary of the activities students will be participating in along with an outline of what students will need to bring for the camp. The focus of our camp is appreciating God's creation through outdoor activity and building relationships.

Dear Parents/Carers

Purpose:

Camps are a wonderful opportunity for students to build relationships with those around them. They are able to strengthen relationships with existing friends and generate new friendships with different people. Being the beginning of Year 9, it is a very valuable time for them to grow in relationship with each other and their teachers. The camp also aims to provide an opportunity for students to grow in their knowledge and appreciation of God's creation through outdoor activity.

Time:

We will leave the College at 9:15am on Wednesday 20 February. Therefore, students need to be at the College by 9:00am to allow time for packing of coaches, roll marking, final instructions, etc. Students will return at approx. 4pm on Friday 22 February.

Special pick up requests:

Students who want to be picked up from and/or dropped off at Taree Service Centre or Nabiac must have made special arrangements in writing with Mr Dawson *prior* to departure on Wednesday.

Accommodation:

Accommodation will be at Baden-Powell Scout Centre Pennant Hills, Sydney. This is dormitory style and group allocations will be arranged by the staff in consultation with students. Students will need to bring their own bedding.

Meals:

Students will need to bring a packed lunch and drink for Wednesday, and snacks for morning tea. Items like muesli bars, biscuits and fruit. Not lollies! All other meals will be catered for.

Please clearly label all student's gear. A small amount of money for the purchase of souvenirs may be brought to camp if desired, money is not required for purchasing food. Please remember: a day pack or bag; strong comfortable walking shoes; a reusable water bottle; and raincoat (at minimum a bargain store poncho) are all **essential items** for camp.

Working together:

We want students to work together to help each other and share the load. This will apply for the whole time together in meal preparation, free time together, keeping rooms tidy and neat, going to bed and being quiet, devotion time, and all activities. This is to be a time of learning, fun and fellowship for all students and teachers. The teachers are giving up time from their families and they should be able to enjoy this camp as well. ACKNOWLEGEMENT OF INFORMATION

MISBEHAVIOUR, CIGARETTES, ALCOHOL AND PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES ON CAMPS

Please be aware that gross misbehaviour, disobedience which could endanger the safety of the student and/or others, possession of cigarettes, alcohol or any prohibited substance while on a school camp may lead to being withdrawn from the activity and sent home. Parents will be required to collect their child or come to some other appropriate arrangement with the teacher in charge to get them home. Compromising the excursion by such wilful behaviour will not be accepted. Given the clarity of this requirement parents are urged to instruct their children accordingly.

Please note that students on a level 2 card will be unable to attend College camp.

General Comments:

- a) Since one of the aims of the excursion is to encourage interaction among the students, media players are not to be brought.
- b) Mobile phones are not needed on camp and must not be brought; students can be contacted via staff mobile if needed urgently.
- c) If your child suffers from travel sickness it would be appreciated if you could provide them with suitable medication. This will need to be given to staff on the morning of departure, clearly labelled with your child's name and dosage instructions.
- d) While all care will be taken, the College and staff will not be responsible for lost property. Please help your child look after their belongings by clearly labelling each item.
- e) If students would like to meet with any family who are in the area, this should be negotiated with Mr Lawson prior to the excursion and a written permission note sent with your child.
