What is VET in the VCE?

VET stands for *Vocational Education and Training*, and vocation refers to work or employment. **VET in the VCE** programs are designed to give students an exposure to practical skills and an understanding of what it is like to ‘learn through doing’.

So, students can opt to do a VET subject while completing their VCE and, in many cases, the VET qualification contributes towards the VCE and the ATAR.

➤ **Important Update**

The ***Bachelor of Pharmacy (Hons) / Master of Pharmacy*** will be restructured to a **Doctor of Pharmacy** program. This is to bring Monash into line with the entry/practice standards of the Pharmacy Board and global standards. It will remain a 5-year program, with a heavier workload in the final year. **Details will be published in the coming weeks, so watch this space!**



Studying a Common First Year in Engineering

A number of Victorian universities offer a common first year in their Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) degree. The advantage of a **common first year** is that students get to explore various specialisations in their first year, preparing them to choose an engineering field in their second year. So, students get a taste of the various engineering specialisations on offer before deciding which to pursue from the second year.

Deakin University - [Engineering](#)

Deakin offers five engineering specialisations as part of their Bachelor of Engineering degrees, all of which participate in the common first year. The Bachelor of Software Engineering is a separate degree and does not have a common first year with the main Engineering degrees.

Monash University - [Engineering](#)

Monash offers ten engineering specialisations and, all but the Biomedical Engineering specialisation, participate in the common first year.

RMIT University - [Engineering](#)

RMIT offers ten specialisations, all of which are accessible after the common first year.

Swinburne University - [Engineering](#)

Swinburne offers eight engineering majors, and in the common first year, students complete a number of core units that assist them in choosing their major.



Cetacean Sisters Workshop

Marine Science Workshop Series for Secondary School Girls

Cetacean Sisters is a hands-on science program for secondary school girls, focused on dolphin and whale research and conservation in Port Phillip and beyond. Through workshops, mentoring, and real-world data examples, it inspires young women to explore STEM careers.

Held across five engaging sessions, this hands-on program explores the science of whales and dolphins through real-world activities, mentoring, and land-based learning on the shores of Port Phillip or Phillip Island.

Workshop Highlights:

- **Interactive Learning:** Each session includes practical, hands-on experiences focused on the cetaceans of local waters.
- **Expert Mentors:** Led by a local cetacean scientist and her experienced marine science team.
- **STEM Career Insights:** A valuable introduction to marine science pathways and what it's really like to work with wildlife.
- **Small Group Size:** Capped at 12 students to encourage mentoring and peer connection
- **Ongoing Support:** Includes free access to the online platform *Circle Community* app for 12 months of continued connection and learning.

Snapshot of Victoria University (VU) in 2026

- More than 45,000 students from around the world study at one of VU's campuses in the heart of the city, and across Melbourne's western suburbs - [VU Campuses](#). VU also has a campus in Sydney and in Brisbane offering courses for international students.
- VU has a number of academic colleges including *arts & education, business, engineering, health & biomedicine, law & justice, sport & exercise science* - [VU Teaching Colleges and Schools](#).

Casper Entry Requirements for Teacher Qualifications

Casper is an online test designed to assess an applicant's personal and professional attributes. **Casper** is a requirement of applying to many initial teaching training courses in Victoria - [Casper](#). Casper typically takes 65-85 minutes to complete. There are 2 main sections, with 11 scenarios which require typed and video responses.

Many universities offering undergraduate teaching courses will be requiring students sit the **Casper** online test as part of the selection into teaching degrees in 2027. Students are encouraged to browse [VTAC](#) and determine which courses will require the **Casper** for selection. Alternative Entry Requirements for Teacher Qualifications

Students considering applying to enrol in an undergraduate teaching course in Victoria in 2027 are advised to pay careful attention to the entry requirements for each university. Some will require the *Casper* (as mentioned above), others may accept the *Casper* **or** their own, whilst others may only require their own, and not the *Casper*. The table below is to be used as a guide only, and students should refer to VTAC and the individual university websites for the most up-to-date information.

➤ **New Courses in 2027**

Monash is pleased to announce that several *new* courses are set to commence in 2027.

- Bachelor of Artificial Intelligence: 3 years
- Bachelor of Laws (Honours) and Bachelor of Architectural Studies: 5 years
- Bachelor of Laws (Honours) and Bachelor of Art History and Curating: 5 years
- Bachelor of Laws (Honours) and Bachelor of Design: 5 years
- Bachelor of Architectural Studies and Bachelor of Global Studies 4 years
- Bachelor of Design in chosen specialisation and Bachelor of Global Studies: 4 years
- Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours): 4 years, Doctor of Pharmacy: 1 year
- Allied Health – Occupational Therapy: 3 years (eligible rural and regional students only)
- Allied Health – Physiotherapy: 3 years (eligible rural and regional students only)
- Allied Health – Podiatry: 3 years (eligible rural and regional students only)

➤ **Updates regarding Engineering at Monash**

There have been some updates around entry into Engineering at Monash.

- Biology (study score of 30) is being added as a prerequisite from Sem 1 2027. So students can enter with Biology (30) OR Physics (25) OR Chemistry (25), plus existing maths and English requirements.
- Subject bonusing will be removed from Sem 1 2027 for all Engineering managed courses
- From Sem 1 2027, the Engineering/Arts double degree will now take 5.5 years to complete, but ALL Arts majors will now be available (this was previously restricted)
- From Sem 1 2027, the Engineering/Law double degree will take 6.5 years.
