Level crossing works and road closure

Toolamba

October 2023

We're installing new track and signalling infrastructure as part of the Shepparton Line Upgrade, which will allow for more frequent and reliable services for passengers.

Thank you for your patience while this important work is underway.

What we are doing

We're undertaking works on the rail line at the Wren Street level crossing, affecting how you will travel in and around Toolamba.

These works include:

- removal of existing rail and sleepers
- import of structural fill
- construction and placement of new turnouts
- replacing ballast
- tamping track
- drainage works.

So these works can safely take place, Wren Street will be closed to vehicles at the level crossing from Friday 13 October to Saturday 21st October.

Detour routes will be in place via the Cummins Road level crossing for both east and westbound travel. Road users should allow an additional 5 mins for their journey.

Pedestrian access over the level crossing at Wren Street will be maintained via a temporary pedestrian crossing.

What to be aware of

There will be an increase in heavy machinery, vehicles, and workers in the area, so please observe all safety signage in place.

Shepparton Line Upgrade

The Shepparton Line Upgrade is delivering more frequent and reliable services on modern VLocity trains.

Stage 1 is complete, delivering 10 extra weekly services along the line, and Stage 2 delivered VLocity trains to Shepparton for the first time in late 2022.

Stage 3, which is underway, will enable nine daily return services on weekdays between Shepparton and Melbourne.

The Shepparton Line Upgrade is creating more than 600 jobs.

The project is part of the Regional Rail Revival program which is upgrading every regional passenger line in Victoria and creating 3,000 jobs. Rail Projects Victoria is delivering the program on behalf of the Australian and Victorian governments







How we're minimising impacts

Dust

We use a range of measures to minimise dust from construction activities, including placing dust monitors in and around the construction site, staging works to minimise exposed areas and using water carts to wet down work areas. Trucks using spoil are covered to minimise dust impacts.

Noise and vibration

To minimise potential impacts, we monitor noise and vibration levels to make sure they are within the Environment Protection guidelines and limit out of hours work.
