Engineers - could it be for me?

Engineers design and build heaps of the things we use every day — from bridges and cars to apps and renewable energy systems. Most uni courses lead into a specific area but you can mix things up with double degrees or further study later on.

Some engineering fields focus on certain tech, like automotive, aerospace, biomedical or marine. Others work with core systems and materials, like mechanical, electrical, chemical or materials engineering. There are also areas focused on natural resources, including agricultural, environmental and mining engineering. Newer and fast-growing fields include aeronautics, informatics, mechatronics, alternative energy and genetic engineering. Check out the engineering courses at the universities you are thinking of attending and get a better idea about what you will learn.

Industry trends: Residential construction sector

Residential construction is all about planning, building and renovating homes — from single houses to big apartment blocks. It's a huge part of Australia's building industry and supports loads of jobs. Through the National Housing Accord, governments across Australia have committed to building 1.2 million new homes over five years from mid-2024. To make that happen, there needs to be a big boost in skilled tradies — including electricians, carpenters, plumbers, bricklayers and painters. [Click here to read more including:](#)

It's clear the sector needs to grow fast and that means plenty of opportunities for people considering a trade.

It's time to start networking!

“Networking... already?” Yep, and it matters. Networking just means getting to know people and building positive relationships. It's not about being best mates with everyone. A lot of jobs aren't even advertised, so chatting to people you know can lead to opportunities you'd never find online.

- How to start while you're still at school:
- Talk to your parents' friends, friends' parents, teachers, coaches and part-time workmates
- Share your career ideas and ask what they do and how they got there
- Be polite, interested and professional
- Start researching pathways and courses
- Set up a simple LinkedIn profile

You never know who knows someone who could help you in the future.

Queensland hiring - are there jobs out there?

Hiring increased in the year to December 2025 and it's getting a bit easier for employers to find staff. About 46% of employers were recruiting — up from last year — while recruitment difficulty dropped to 41%, meaning fewer businesses are struggling to hire. Queensland had the highest hiring rate (58%). In terms of industries, Accommodation and Food Services had the highest hiring rate at 72%, showing strong demand in hospitality and food jobs. When it comes to job types, Technicians and Trades Workers were the hardest roles to fill, with 60% of employers saying they struggled to recruit — meaning trades and technical skills are still in high demand. Trends and shifts

Growth forecasts for industries are just a snapshot based on what we know right now. They can change if the economy shifts or new projects pop up. Instead of stressing over exact numbers, it's better to look at the big picture – the overall trends and where jobs are growing or shrinking. These trends include:

- About anticipating future skills
- Trends and shifts
 - Between 2024-25 and 2028-29 employment in Queensland is projected to increase by 6.2%, more than 185,000 workers.
 - Over the same period, more than 250,000 workers are needed to replace Queenslanders who retire or change jobs.
 - In total, there are more than 430,000 job opportunities expected in Queensland in the near future.
 - The top 10 industries with growing skills needs between 2024-25 to 2028-29 (by number of new workers) are:
 - health care and social assistance
 - public administration and safety
 - education and training
 - professional, science and technical services
 - retail trade
 - accommodation and food services
 - construction
 - transport, postal and warehousing
 - manufacturing
 - other services.

- Get real experience: Apply for paid internships through CareerTrackers to build skills and networks
- Use School support: Connect with your school's Indigenous Student Centre for tutoring, mentoring and advice
- Find a mentor: Someone who can guide you, answer questions and help with career decisions
- Choose culturally safe workplaces: Look for employers with RAPs or strong Indigenous employment programs
- Apply for scholarships: Check options like the Aurora Education Foundation and government programs for after school
- Build your profile: Create a solid resume and a simple LinkedIn page to show your strengths
- Consider VET pathways: Practical training can lead straight into jobs in many industries
- Know your rights: Learn about pay, tax and super through the Fair Work Ombudsman

Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR)

The ATAR is one of the Year 12 scores used across Australia for university entry. It ranges from 0 to 99.95 (highest) in steps of 0.05. In Queensland, the QCAA sends your final Year 12 results to QTAC and QTAC calculates your ATAR. If you apply for courses interstate, the relevant admissions centre will get your ATAR directly from QTAC. You can also order your official ATAR statement through QTAC. **Important:** you must **register with QTAC in August to have your ATAR calculated** – this is a **separate step** from your course application. UCAT ANZ for students wanting to do Medicine or some other health courses in 2026

The UCAT ANZ is a 2-hour computer-based test used by universities for competitive entry into medicine, dentistry and some clinical science degrees. It measures the skills needed for these careers, not your school knowledge. If you're unsure which universities or courses require UCAT, [click here to check before you apply](#). It is a very different type of testing than you are used to, so you'll need to practice! The test has five timed sections, all multiple choice:

Verbal Reasoning – understanding and evaluating written information

Decision Making – using complex info to make good judgements

Quantitative Reasoning – working with numerical data

Abstract Reasoning – spotting patterns and relationships

Situational Judgement – responding appropriately to real-world scenarios
