


MUSIC

In Year 3, students studied Romantic composers such as Paul Dukas and Edvard Grieg. They have also been revising their rhythm knowledge through games and investigating rhythmic patterns using "Lego Beats."

In Year 4, students explored Modern composers like George Gershwin, Jazz pioneers such as Scott Joplin, and even ventured into the world of Chiptune music, learning about composers like Koji Kondo. 
Overall, it was a positive and engaging experience that kept students active while meeting key curriculum outcomes.
