Setting Paragraph

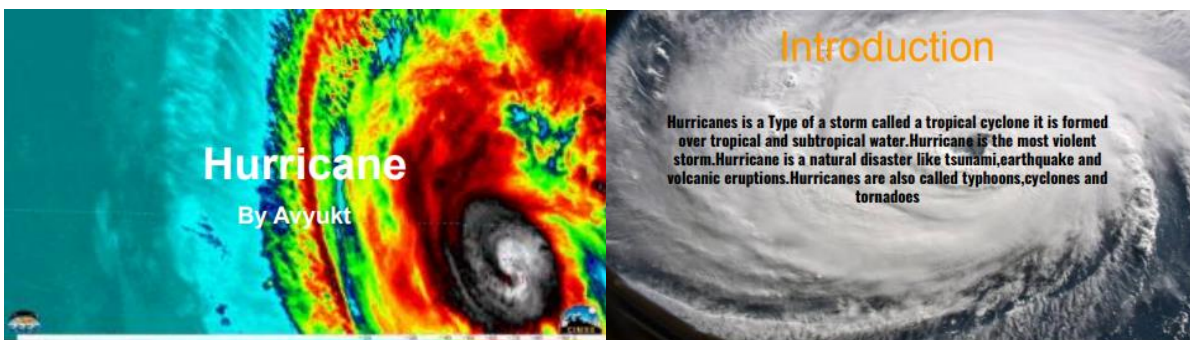

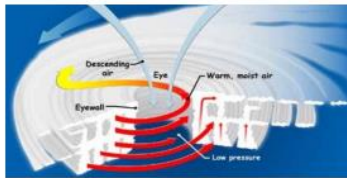

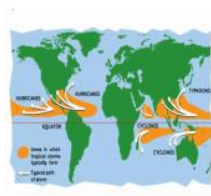
