Dear families,

We would like to extend our gratitude for your generous financial contributions to our school in 2025. Your support directly enhances your child's educational experience, making Toolamba P.S. a truly special place to learn and grow.

This year, we have made significant investments in resources that benefit our students. Notable purchases include new laptops for our senior grades, app and technology management software, interactive television for our communication team and a Cyber Safety subscription that allows us to implement a weekly Cyber Safety Program across the school. We have invested \$32,880 in these initiatives so far this year.

In 2025, our curriculum focus has been on literacy, particularly reading. We are committed to engaging our students in the reading process through substantial investments in literature and professional development. This includes take-home readers, decodable texts tailored for our neurodiverse learners, fiction and nonfiction books, picture story books and a variety of novels to support the introduction of Book Clubs. Staff have participated in whole school Professional Learning around reading which has been extremely beneficial. A total of \$10,461 was spent to support the reading program professional development and \$2,470 so far on new library books.

So far this year, our students have enjoyed a diverse array of free incursions and excursions organized by our dedicated staff. Highlights so far include Hip Hop, Tree Planting, AFLW incursion, AFL Clinic, the Responsible Pet Program, Cyber Safety Session with Victoria Police, Bravehearts, a special Mother's Day Breakfast, Pyjama Day, Book Week, Pet Parade, Toolamba Athletics, Cross Country, Book Fair and Dental Van.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian Curriculum, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and resources for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time.

Payment Methods

Option A Payment through our <u>COS Parent Portal</u> when purchasing Back to School Supplies. There is an option for you to pay upfront.

Option B Full amount in Term 1, 2026 through Xuno.

Option C **Other payment arrangements**. If selecting this, please make an appointment with the school to discuss your circumstances and the available options.

Option D I have completed a **CSEF application** form to pay for swimming, excursions, and incursions. I will pay the balance using one of the above options (A or B).

CSEF: Eligible families can apply for \$400 per Primary School student from 2026. **These funds can only be used for camps, excursions, sports and swimming**

Refunds

Our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally, we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred to a third party. For example, camp costs when a child becomes unwell and cannot attend in circumstances where the payment has already been made or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will make this clear to parents at the time of payment.

Financial Support for Families

Toolamba Primary School appreciates that families may sometimes experience financial difficulties in meeting requests for payments and contributions. A range of support options are available to assist eligible parents. These options include:

- State School's Relief
- <u>Second-Hand School Uniform</u> In order to support parents in meeting the costs of their children's education the school has a supply of second-hand uniforms.
- CSEF Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund available to all eligible families
- <u>CSEF</u> Foundation CSEF Uniform Package available to all eligible families.
- <u>Saver Plus</u> is an initiative of Brotherhood of St Laurence and ANZ, delivered locally by community organisations in 22 locations in Victoria. Saver Plus assists individuals and families on lower incomes to have every dollar up to \$500 saved over a 10-month period matched by ANZ to go towards education-related costs.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
