Paper Planes



Make paper planes together. Decorate them, fly them and improve the design. Make up games like the longest flight, the furthest flight and who can land closest to the target.

Design your own family flag or symbol and display it proudly in your at home. Is there an animal, shape or colour that's important to your family which could feature in your flag?

Dress up Dad



Dress ups are always fun. You might like to choose some items from his wardrobe or maybe you have a dress up box to use. Does dad need a hat for your adventure? Perhaps he needs a face painted beard?



Access to dad's wardrobe, fancy dress pieces, face paint.



Family Band



Start a family band and make your own instruments with items found around the house. What everyday household items can you make different sounds with?



General household items.



Talent Showcase



Create your own dance or song and host a performance for your family.



Make Your Own Monster



Dress up like a scary monster and take a group photo! What does your monster look like?



Suggested: access to fancy dress box, household linen/sheets.



Cook Up



Who's hungry? Prepare and cook your dinner together. How many foods with different colours can you fit on your plate?

Magic Potions



Make and mix your own magic potion using items found outside in the garden. What does your magic potion do?



Outdoor garden, mixing bowl, spoon or stick to stir.



Apple Bobbing



Half fill a bucket with cool water and float several apples in the water. Taking it in turns, each person puts their hands behind their back and attempts to catch an apple with their teeth in the quickest time.



Bucket, access to water, several apples, stopwatch.



Alphabet Scavenger Hunt



Can you find items around your house, garden or local park that start with each letter of the alphabet?



Obstacle Course



Build your own obstacle course using only the items you can find around your home then race each other to complete it in the fastest time.



Sleeping Bag Race or Relay



Similar to the much loved potato sack race only using your sleeping bags to race to the finish or time trial a team relay. If you're worried about getting your sleeping bags dirty, use a plastic garbage bag instead.



Sleeping bags or plastic garbage bags.



Lights, Camera, Action



Make your own mini-movie about an adventure you'd like to have. This could be as high tech or low budget as you like and if you can't film your movie, just storyboard it on paper.



Your choice. Phone/video camera, pens & paper.



Spotlight



Find a semi-dark place and make sure there are plenty of hiding spots. Choose someone to be 'it' and give them a torch to help them 'seek' then everyone else hides. Don't get caught!

Green Thumb



Plant something together in the garden or a pot and watch it grow over the coming weeks or months.

 Plant/seedlings, soil, pot, gloves.



Shadow Puppets



Get creative with the items around you and make shadow puppets onto your wall or tent. How many different shapes or animals can you make?

Dad's Choice



Ask dad to share some stories about how he used to play as a kid. Choose one of those things to try together.
