PARISH NEWS

Dear Parishioners, A Novena to Our Lady Help of Christians will be prayed every day at Mass till the 24th May.

I am sure you may be aware we received news this week that restrictions on our churches will begin to relax. As of Wednesday 13th May, religious organisations can hold services for up to 10 people.

In all cases, the following requirements apply: social-distancing rules of at least 1.5m observed between attendees and allowing 4 square meters per person. A register of attendees, including name and phone number of attendees will need to be recorded. Cleaning by wiping surfaces with disinfectant, parishioners at risk should stay at home (including elderly, frail, those with chronic illness or immune-compromised), you must stay home if you are sick, displaying any respiratory, cold or flu like symptoms however slight.

With this very welcome news, Fr Stanly and I will return to celebrating our regular weekend Masses Saturday 6.00pm, Sunday 7.30am, 9.00am, 10.45am and 6.00pm from next weekend 23rd May. Masses will continue to be Livestreamed on Saturday 6.00pm, Sunday 9.00am and weekdays at 9.30am for those who are unable to be physically present in the Church

In addition to this, the Parish Hall will be open for an additional 10 people to attend the 9.00am and 10.45am Sunday Mass. As of Tuesday 19th May, for 3 weeks, weekday Masses will be celebrated at 9.30am and 6.30pm from Tuesday to Friday to allow more parishioners to attend a Mass.

Only those who have registered will be allowed into the Church, the Church doors will be locked 10 minutes before Mass commences. Please note that 10 people (babies and children) are counted as individuals. For those attending weekend Masses, Stewardship and Presbytery collections can be placed in basket on the Sanctuary.

If you would like to attend a Mass, a booking is essential! Bookings will be strictly taken through the parish office on Monday between 9.00am and 11.00am. Please phone 5996 1985, bookings at this stage will be taken for the coming week. Please consider those who have been unable to access Livestreamed Masses. We apologize in advance as not everyone will be able to get a weekend Mass.

We are planning to open the Church for private prayer during the day. Therefore, with this in mind I am inviting parishioners to contact the parish office, if you are able to assist help sanitize and supervise a prayer time in the Church.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers as we will continue to pray and to do our best to support you in any way we can.

FIRST READING

Acts 8:5-8.14-17

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town. When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. 
John 14:15-21

Something to Think About

Even though we cannot see Jesus, we can experience his presence in many different ways. The Spirit is at work in the world, bringing love, joy, kindness, patience and gentleness. The main message in today's gospel is to love Jesus and to do as he commands. What does love look like.... feel like.... and sound like?

The Story

Jesus reminds the disciples that the way to show their love for him is to keep his commandments. However, the disciples are still fearful and anxious so Jesus promises them a comforter and helper – the Holy Spirit.

They are not to feel alone or like orphans.

The Holy Spirit will help them to know Jesus as the one sent by the Father.

Family Discussion

Begin by talking about activities we need help with before we can do them on our own, e.g. riding a bike, swimming, tying shoelaces.

Now talk about activities that we still need help with e.g. learning a new language, baking a new recipe.

Help is something we need all through our lives!! This is true for us as disciples of Jesus.

Talk about times when you have needed help to show your love for Jesus by keeping his

commandments.




