

Parent Newsletter Term 3

Year 4

The Year 4 Team is looking forward to a fun and productive Term 3. This term our Inquiry unit is Science. We will be covering the areas of earth and space science. Our big question is: how might we influence how the Earth works for the survival of the planet? We have some incursions booked this term, run by Hands On Science in Week 6.

In English, we will be completing a novel study (Nim's Island) and exploring different reading strategies to develop students' comprehension. For writing, we will be looking at sentence structure and fluency. There will also be weekly spelling sessions.

In Numeracy, we will be focusing on multiplication, probability, area and volume. We encourage our students to continue learning their multiplication facts – including at home – and committing them to memory. Automatic recall of multiplication facts (up to 10×10) is a curriculum target by the end of Year 4.

Students will set learning goals at the start of term, and then reflect on them at term's end.

Every Tuesday, students will participate in athletics training and will need to wear appropriate clothing for these sessions. The House Athletics and District Athletics Carnivals will take place this term.
