Welcome to Term Three! Below is a summary of the learning that will be happening this Term as well as other important information.

Reminders:

- All students require a diary (school supplied) which is to be signed once a week and handed in to your classroom teacher
- Absences can be reported to the school via Parent Access Module (PAM)

Attendance at school

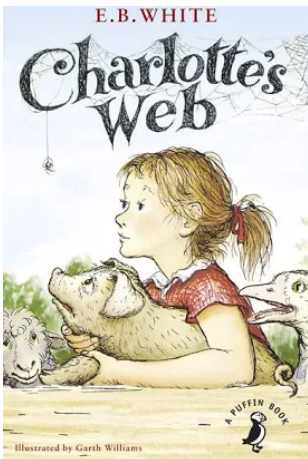
Every day counts, as regular attendance helps students to develop a sense of belonging, develop and maintain friendships, be more engaged at school and help progress with their learning.

If you do the Maths, a student absent one day a week = 40 days per year = 8 school weeks (close to a term) x 7 school years = 56 weeks = more than 1 year of school missed before they reach secondary school.

Religious Education

In Religion this term, students will focus on “The Mass”- the importance for Catholics, its purpose, the structure, the special words the priest says and the responses we say.

Later in the term, we will be learning about other faiths. If you or your family has another faith and you would like to briefly share about it with your child’s class please let us know.

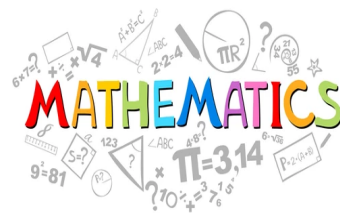


English

This term in English, our students will be immersed in the much-loved novel Charlotte's Web by E.B. White while also exploring the fascinating world of the Vikings in the second half of the term. Students will strengthen their writing skills through explicit sentence-level instruction, including sentence combining, sentence summaries and the use of rich vocabulary to create more engaging writing. They will apply these skills by planning and writing their own imaginative narratives inspired by Charlotte's Web. Students will also take part in a Design and Technologies project where they will investigate Viking ships before designing and creating their own Viking longship. It promises to be an exciting term filled with creativity, history and opportunities to develop confident readers, writers and designers.

Mathematics

This term in Mathematics, the students will continue developing their recall of number facts including times tables and counting facts. They will focus on various areas of Mathematics including fractions, decimals, location, data, 3D shapes and the four operations. We will continue to develop a variety of strategies to solve different types of word problems. There will be many opportunities for students to learn and practise new skills, while others are extended. Students will use the Rockstar Maths program to support their learning at school and are encouraged to use this at home to strengthen their fluency skills.



Homework

All students are expected to read for at least 60 minutes per week and record this into their diaries. We encourage students to record when they practise their times tables facts or use Rockstar Maths in their diary as they do with their reading. Students are expected to get their diary signed each week by a parent and to hand this up to the class teacher each Friday.

We also encourage students to practise times table facts each week. Your child should have their login details to Rockstar Maths in their diaries, but your children are encouraged to practise their times tables as much as possible, in the car, at the dinner table, everywhere! Automatic recall of multiplication facts will help your child feel more confident in Maths. Children have a much higher chance of retaining these facts if they practise them in contexts outside of school, as well.
