





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



# Out-of-Uniform Procedures



- Parent/Carer is required to write a note in the diary to the Pastoral Mentor.
- Students must show the note to the Pastoral Mentor during Pastoral Group.
- Students are provided with an out-of-uniform slip (blue form) by the Pastoral Mentor, which must be carried by the student for the duration of the day.
- Uniform inspections are held by teachers throughout the day.
- Should a note from home not be provided, the student will receive a lunch detention.






# Diary Use

- Communication of Homework & Assessment Tasks.
- Dates of College events.
- Parents check & sign on a weekly basis (Monday evening).
- Pastoral Mentor checks usage weekly (Tuesday morning).
- If there is no homework, students should record the work completed in that lesson for study purposes.
- Parents to communicate uniform, early departures from school or late to school notes to show staff.

# Laptop Use

- A laptop bag must be used to carry the laptop, charger and any other learning equipment to class.
- Accidental damage cover is included. If a laptop is accidentally damaged, students must take it to the library. This cover is available once every 12 months. Any additional damage within this period will be at the parent/carers' expense. A loan laptop will be provided during repairs.
- No games are to be saved on the hard drive.
- Laptops must be charged at home overnight.
- Laptops are not to be used in the playground.
- Students must save all work on their Google Drive, which must be installed on their desktop.





# Mobile Phone Use

- Mobile phones must be turned off and stored in lockers for the duration of the day – only used for 10 minutes at the beginning of each lunch break.
- Air pods and earphones are not to be used except for educational purposes.
- The Mobile Device Procedure can be found in the College Behaviour Support Plan, located on the College website.





# Jewellery

Jewellery is to be discreet, meaning not particularly noticeable, and is limited to:

- 1 x Watch
- 1 x Silver or gold simple necklace with a religious medallion or cross only, worn under the College uniform, **not visible**.
- 1 x Small silver or gold sleeper/stud in each earlobe only, no larger than 5 mm.
- Visible piercings other than earrings, as described above, must be removed whilst in school uniform; this includes clear or thin-coloured piercings.
- Jewellery not adhering to school guidelines will be secured by a teacher in an envelope and can be collected from the Student Restorative Room at the end of the school day. Students will be issued with a lunch time detention for a uniform infringement.





# Personal Grooming

- Hair must be of a conventional style, neat and natural in colour, shade and tone. Examples of unacceptable styles include but are not limited to mullets, undercuts, shaved patterns, skin fades, steps, lines, dreadlocks, corn-rows, marked contrasts of length, and crewcuts less than number 3 comb length.
- If your child's hair does not comply with the Personal Grooming standards in the College Behaviour Support Plan, you will be contacted by the Head of Year to arrange a timeframe for it to be corrected.






# College Library


