UAC SRS Offers - Lock in your preferences for SRS offers

If you're in Year 12 and you've applied for undergraduate study through the Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS), it's time to lock in your preferences: the first offer round is just around the corner.

On 12 November you can receive either an unconditional offer or a conditional offer.

If you receive an unconditional offer, congratulations! Go ahead and accept it. If you want to stay in the running for another offer in subsequent rounds, move the course you've been offered down to the bottom of your list of course preferences or remove it entirely. (As long as you have accepted the offer, you can't lose it.)

If you receive a conditional offer, you still need to meet additional criteria before the institution will make you an unconditional offer in January Round 2 (on 26 January). The institution will tell you what these are in the conditional offer email you receive on 12 November.

UNSW Medicine Entry Changes

In light of recent changes to the HSC exams and ATAR release date, we have updated the UNSW Medicine application timeline for our 2022 intake in order to ensure it is fair and equitable for all applicants.

Interviews will commence on the day of ATAR release (20 January 2022). Students competitive for an interview will be notified via email by 10am on Thursday, 20 January 2022. All UNSW interviews will take place online via Zoom and applicants will need to be available for their allocated timeslot. Please note that students may receive an invitation for an interview held on the same day and are therefore advised to closely monitor their emails.

The interview selection process remains unchanged and is based on the competitiveness of a student's Academic Merit (e.g. ATAR) and UCAT ANZ results. For more information on the interview selection process, please visit the : [UNSW Medicine website](#).

Students can be considered for EAPL points for undergraduate study at UNSW. The EAPL Program awards up to five points to high school leavers who have excelled in areas of sport, academia, leadership, and/or music at an elite level. Activities and/or commitments must have been undertaken in years 11 and/or 12.

Students must submit an application and provide supporting documentation by 10 December 2021 to be considered for adjustment factors.

Tocal Farming and Agriculture Scholarship Program

Most close at the end of November 2021

Benefactors' contributions allow up to 60% of our students to receive a scholarship to assist them with their regular College fees.

Scholarships vary in amount from \$1,000 to \$5,000 per student and are allocated by an Independent Scholarship Selection Panel. The main selection criterion is financial need, but other important considerations include likely contribution to community, dedication to studies and intended career path.

A single [Scholarship Application Form](#) is available which applies to all scholarships generally. A small number of scholarships have specific selection criteria requested by the benefactor which is usually associated with the applicant's chosen field of work. Unless otherwise stated, applications for the above scholarships close at the end of November. Successful applicants are notified in December/January. A covering letter providing information on the financial position of the applicant and their family (including taxable income) is recommended.
