FEES POLICY

Fees are clearly a charge for service and there is an expectation that instalment deadlines be met unless there is a prior arrangement with the Manage Corporate Services.

ACCEPTANCE DEPOSIT

- A deposit of \$200.00 is payable upon acceptance of an offer at the College.
- The \$200.00 deposit is credited against 1st Term Residential Fees or day student fees.
- The Acceptance Deposit is fully refunded in the event of a written withdrawal being received prior to the commencement of Term One.

RESIDENTIAL FEE

- The first and second instalments of residential fees must be cleared by the end of Semester One for students to be able to continue in residence in Semester Two.
- The third instalment is to be cleared before the commencement of Term Four
- Failure to clear all outstanding fees from Year 10 or Year 11 will result in residency being denied at the commencement of the following year unless prior arrangements have been made with the Principal.
- All fee's need to be paid in full BEFORE the commencement of Term 4.

NB: Students may attend the education program as a day student

COLLEGE CHARGES

- These fees are to be paid on the first day the student is in attendance at the College.

REFUND RESIDENTIAL BOARDING FEES

If a student leaves the College through their own choice or through termination of residency, fees remain payable for the number of weeks the student has been in residence. Parents will be refunded the excess if applicable on a pro rata basis.

REFUND COLLEGE CHARGES

If a student ceases the educational program at the College, pro rata of Charges less the percentage of Government Subsidy, will be refunded to parents according to the time of the year.

- 1st Term : Seventy Five Percent (75%) refund
- 2nd Term : Fifty Percent (50%) refund
- 3rd & 4th Term : No refund

This Fees Refund Policy is consistent with the Department of Education Fees Policies.

NO REFUND of fees is payable for any period of short term absence by a students from the College. Fee refunds for long term absences should be negotiated with the Principal.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

BOARDING FROM HOME ALLOWANCE – SPECIAL SUBSIDY

This subsidy is not available to students who are in receipt of the following:

- Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC)
- Youth Allowance at the Away From Home Rate
- Abstudy with full boarding paid by Centrelink

Application forms will be available on enrolment day, parents need to be completed and returned to the College.

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

The Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Family Health Care Card, Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or a Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

PLEASE NOTE: The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued each year and expires in December each year.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance which can be paid to the college or parent/guardian
- \$235 Education Program Allowance which is paid directly to the college and will be deducted from contributions and course charges.

Application forms are completed at the College in Term 1 each year with the closing date being the last day of term ie **1st April 2021**.

ASSISTANCE FOR ISOLATED CHILDREN

AIC aims to assist the families of primary, secondary and under 16 year old tertiary students who are unable to attend an appropriate government school on a daily basis because of geographic isolation.

An appropriate government school is one which offers the student's level of study or, if the student has special health-related or educational needs, one which provides access to the facilities, programmes and-or environment required for those needs.

A student may be regarded as geographically isolated from appropriate schooling if one of the following rules are met:

Rule 1 – The distance between the principal family home and the nearest appropriate state school is at least 56 kilometres via the shortest practicable route, or

Rule 2 – The distance between the principal family home and the nearest appropriate state school (via the shortest practicable route) is at least 16 kilometre AND the distance between the principal family home and the nearest available transport service to the nearest appropriate state school is at least 4.5 kilometres via the shortest practicable route.

Rule 3 – If Geographic Isolation Rules 1 or 2 do not apply but there are other circumstances that make it impracticable for the student to travel between the family home and the nearest state school on at least 20 school days of the year then Geographic Isolation Rule 3 may apply. Evidence must be provided.

ABSTUDY

FINANCIAL INFORMATION - COLLEGE FEES AND CHARGES

YEAR 10, 11 & 12 COSTS

These fees include:

- Subject Costs
- Compulsory course charges and other services provided by the College, which are not directly part of the educational program.

Full details of these costs are included in this booklet.

RESIDENTIAL BOARDING FEES

The Corporate Executive of the Department of Education determines Residential Boarding Fees at Agricultural Schools and Colleges. The residential status of students is conditional on the payment of this fee

DAY STUDENT MEAL CHARGES

This charge is for the supply of morning tea and lunch supplied to Day Students on a daily basis. This amount is cost recovery of the food component only. The annual fee is \$880.00 which is payable in two instalments (1st day of each semester).

EXCURSION COSTS

An amount has been charged for Residential Excursions. This sum of money will be used throughout the year for student excursions (eg: Busselton Camp, Zoo trip etc). At the end of the year any unused portion will be refunded to parents or carried forward to the following year. This eliminates the need for students to carry cash at school for such events.

TRADES PERSONAL PROJECT COSTS

All Metals and Engineering and Furnishing students are required to make a personal project. Students are required to meet the costs of their personal projects. Past costs of these have ranged from \$10 - \$10 000 relative to the scale and complexity of the project. The students, in consultation with the parents and teachers, will be required to prepare a costing for their approved project. 50% payment of this cost will then be required to be made prior to the ordering of materials. If any changes are made from the initial quotation, parents will need to approve the price variation for work to continue.

All safety equipment items listed below are required and available from the College. However, you may wish to purchase them elsewhere. Students require these for the entire time whilst at the College.

REPLACEMENT OF COLLEGE ITEMS

Replacement equipment is available at the College and are charged as follows:

Safety Glasses	7.00 inc. GST (Must be medium impact/velocity or higher, non tinted)
Hygiene Earplugs	10.00 inc. GST (Must be medium to high decibel rating approx 30 db)

Every boarder will be issued a key to their dorm, padlock for their cupboard and a laundry basket. These items need to be returned when the student leaves the College. If there is a loss or damage to these, the following charges will apply:

- Replace dorm key \$20
- Replace White Card \$20
- Replace padlock \$80
- Replace laundry basket \$20
- Replace student carpark permit \$10
- Past student re-issue of Certificates (Cert II, Cert III etc) \$20 per Certificate

Ownership of these items will be checked out at the end of each term and charges will be applied accordingly.

STUDENT DAMAGE TO COLLEGE PROPERTY

If a student maliciously damages College property, they will be required to pay for the cost of repair or replacement.

DFES/FIRE ALARMS

There is a financial cost of \$920 for any student involved or found to have instigated a **FALSE ALARM. This charge will be forwarded to Parents/Guardians.**

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The WA College of Agriculture Harvey invites current students to participate in its scholarship program.

The scholarship program is important as it places a focus on and recognises outstanding achievement amongst individuals attending the College and encourages students to consider their future options. Scholarships and awards are presented during the graduation ceremony. Information is sent out regarding scholarships at the end of Term 3 each year.

Scholarships must be used to assist with the costs towards further studies at the College.

The following list identifies the current scholarships available to students attending the WA College of Agriculture at Harvey. The scholarships are subject to change from year to year.

LP & JA FRYER—\$500 SCHOLARSHIP (SPECIFIC TO HARVEY)

Awarded to a worthy Year 10 student who will be continuing in Year 11.

FRIENDS OF HARVEY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE—\$250 (SPECIFIC TO HARVEY)

Awarded to a deserving Year 10 or 11 student intending to continue his/her education at Harvey Ag College in any stream of study. This scholarship stipulates a hardship provision and the recipient has the prize deducted from their school fees.

FARMWEST—\$200 (SPECIFIC TO HARVEY)

Awarded to a deserving Year 11 student who has a significant interest in beef/dairy, intending to continue his/her education at Harvey Ag College in any stream of study. Recipient has the award deducted from school fees or books.

HARVEY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP \$500 (SPECIFIC TO HARVEY)

Awarded to a student in Year 11 who has undergone some difficulties but has used the opportunity afforded them to access agricultural education at the Residential College of Agriculture at Harvey.

BRUNSWICK AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY—\$1000
