# **Numeracy**

Each Maths lesson will follow a carefully designed evidenced based structure:

- •5 minutes: Developing mathematical fluency.
- •15 minutes: Reviewing previously learned concepts.
- •25 minutes: Explicit instruction of new concepts.
- •15 minutes: Practicing newly introduced skills

This approach ensures a well-rounded and engaging learning experience, supporting both skill development and a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts.

Throughout Term 3, Year 4 students will explore key mathematical concepts through engaging and focused lessons. They will work on the following areas:

- Multiplication and division: Students will use a range of strategies to solve multiplication and division problems, including those involving larger numbers and interpreting remainders.
- •Angles: Students will estimate, compare and classify angles using formal units of measurement.
- Fractions: Students will model, compare and represent common fractions, including mixed numbers, and use them to solve problems in real-life contexts.
- •Location: Students will use grid references, directional language and simple maps to describe and locate positions on a grid.
- **Decimals:** Students will recognise, represent and compare decimals to tenths and hundredths in real-life situations.

These units are thoughtfully designed to build your child's confidence and mathematical skills through hands-on, meaningful learning experiences.

# **English**

Each English lesson will continue to follow a carefully structured, evidence-based approach designed to support skill development and deepen students' understanding of literacy and literature. This consistent framework ensures that all learners are engaged and making progress in both reading and writing.

This term, Year 4 students will begin with a focus on our new topic from the knowledge-rich curriculum: *Our Blue Planet* (Earth and Space Sciences). Students will engage with a variety of factual texts to build content knowledge and vocabulary related to Earth, space, and the natural world. Our daily reviews and targeted literacy skills sessions will continue to support students in developing their understanding of morphology, grammar, and vocabulary.

Later in the term, we will shift our writing focus to Information Reports, as part of *Our Health is Our Wealth* unit. Students will learn to research, organise, and present factual information clearly and accurately. They will be guided to use topic-specific language and structured paragraphing to communicate their ideas effectively.

To support your child at home, we encourage reading factual texts together, discussing key facts and ideas, and helping them become familiar with the features of informative writing.

We will also continue our daily **Spelling Mastery** lessons. This program develops strong and reliable spelling skills through a highly structured direct instruction approach, blending three key strategies:

- **Phonemic approach** Helps beginning spellers understand the relationship between spoken sounds and written letters, enabling them to apply this knowledge to spelling.
- **Morphemic approach** Introduces advanced spellers to prefixes, bases, and suffixes, deepening their understanding of word structure.
- **Whole-word approach** Provides spellers at all levels with the meaning and root of words, demonstrating how spelling is influenced.

**Spelling Mastery** integrates these approaches based on students' skill levels, offering clear, sequential lessons that effectively build spelling proficiency. Through explicit instruction, careful word selection, and repeated, cumulative practice, students master concepts while reinforcing and retaining key information—supporting their development as confident readers and writers.

# Religion

Our Morning Circles will continue to launch our day in a positive manner and are a valuable time to allow for gathering and sharing news and events. We also will continue to have a focus on our weekly value, our expectations and discussing what is going well currently and areas we may need to focus on.

Our Religion topic this term is The Last Supper (Luke 22:14–20) where Jesus shows what true witness is: giving of oneself. The Eucharist sends us out to be witnesses of love. Students can witness through reverence, gratitude, and acts of service. This ties in beautifully with the making of First Communion in Week 4.

Please look out for our current homework sheets as the children are asked to do some of their preparation at home with their families. We hope to engage parents in the role of preparation as well as help children not participating on the night to engage more fully with the classroom activities.

Our second unit will be aligned to our Topic work and reflecting on our role as stewards of creation, our beautiful planet and making positive choices.

### **RRRR**

Our two topics in Year 4 this term are:

Gender Norms and Stereotypes

Students consider the influence of gender norms on attitudes, opportunities and behaviour. They learn about gender equality, inclusion, human rights and the importance of relationships that respect people of all genders.

#### Positive Gender Relationships

Students develop an understanding that verbal, physical, emotional, financial and sexual forms of violence are harmful, and that these forms of violence can also be gendered. They learn about safe and unsafe behaviours, consent and their rights to bodily autonomy. They practice strategies they can use to assert their rights to bodily autonomy to be free from coercion or violence. They develop self-care, peer support, peer referral and help-seeking skills that they can use in response to situations involving gender-based violence within family, peer, school, community or online relationships.

# Topic

As students continue to master their Reading to Learn skills, they will further explore the topic of 'Our Blue Planet'. This exploration will be integrated into our Reading to Learn lessons, in addition to our two weekly topic sessions. They will focus on the formation of Rocks, Minerals and Soils, with a community walk to Sandringham beach to explore the erosion of rocks around us. Additionally, they will explore The Sun, Earth and Moon. In this unit, students will enquire into the Earth's relationship with the Sun, and how the Sun, Earth and Moon interact. They will learn that the rotation of the Earth on its axis causes regular changes, including night and day, and the pattern of the seasons. This will be paired nicely with a visit to IMAX and the Melbourne Museum for a hands-on experience of learned content.

# Homework

In Year Four, homework is designed to be a simple extension of what we are learning in class. It supports students' development and helps reinforce key skills in a manageable and meaningful way.

This term, homework books will be collected on Mondays and returned with new tasks on Tuesdays. Each week, students will complete a maths activity that revises the concepts covered in the previous

week. For example, if we focus on multiplication and division in Week 1, the homework in Week 2 will provide a chance to revise and practise those skills.

We are also sending home for a few weeks a reading sheet and task for First Communion preparation and ask that <u>ALL</u> children complete the task regardless of whether they are making their First Communion. We have discussed ways to support everyone in class so please reach out if you require additional help.

Students also have access to Times Tables Rockstars and are encouraged to use it for 10 minutes <u>each night</u>. This regular practice helps build number fluency and supports their progress in class. We regularly put a copy of the heat map showing their progress towards 'going green' and celebrate their growth.

Reading continues to be a vital part of our homework routine. We ask that students read for 15 to 20 minutes each night. This should include reading aloud at least once a week, as reading to an audience is a valuable skill that differs from silent reading. We also recommend that families take turns reading aloud together. Hearing fluent, expressive reading is a powerful way to model good habits and build a shared love of stories
