Brisbane City Council Apprenticeships

Brisbane City Council has not published a set date for its 2027 apprenticeship intake. It advertises apprenticeships as vacancies become available throughout the year. It is worth checking regularly. You can:

What do Locksmiths do?

- Installing security systems, changes tumblers in locks, changing locks, cuts keys and opens locks by manipulation

What does a Registered Nurse (Community Health) do?

Registered Nurses (Community Health) provide nursing care, health counselling, screening and education to individuals, families and groups in the wider community with a focus on patient independence and health promotion. Day-to-day tasks include:

- assesses, plans, implements and evaluates nursing care for patients according to accepted nursing practice and standards

- providing interventions, treatments and therapies such as medications, and monitors responses to treatment and care plans

Commonwealth Scholarships

There are three types of Commonwealth scholarships:

[Student Start-Up Loan](#) – Available to eligible full-time students in higher education who receive Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY Living Allowance and you must apply.

[Relocation Scholarship](#) – This is an annual payment to help eligible ABSTUDY or Youth Allowance students with their higher education if they have relocated to, or from, a regional or remote area to study.

[Payments and support for Indigenous Australians](#) - You may be eligible if you're studying or training. [ABSTUDY](#) is a group of payments for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students or apprentices.

30 September is the QTAC Early Bird deadline. Apply by this date to pay \$75 instead of \$159. If paying by debit card, pay by 25 September to allow time for processing. International Baccalaureate (IB) Studies

Australian universities recognise the IB Diploma as equivalent to Year 12 QCE. IB scores from 24 to 45 are converted to a National ATAR, allowing IB students to compete for university places alongside students who receive an ATAR. QTAC then uses this result to calculate a selection rank. [Find out how it works here.](#)

Pros and cons of mid-year entry

Many tertiary courses give you the choice of starting in Semester 1 or mid-year.

Benefits of starting mid-year

- Enjoy a longer break after Year 12.
- Reapply if you miss out on a Semester 1 offer.

- Complete a preparation or pathway course first.
- You may still graduate on time by studying over summer or in Trimester 3.

Things to consider

- Not all courses offer mid-year entry.
- Fewer places may make mid entry more competitive.
- You may lose motivation or get out of the study habit.

Another option is to apply for Semester 1 and defer. Check with the institution to see if you can defer for six months.

You HAVE TO register with QTAC to get your ATAR calculated!

If you're in Year 12 and ATAR eligible, register on the QTAC ATAR Portal to receive your ATAR. Queensland ATARs will be released at 9 am on Friday 18 December 2026. You'll need:

- Your full name
- Date of birth
- LUI number
- A personal email address

You must also submit a separate QTAC application if you want to apply for tertiary courses. Registering is also important if applying interstate, as it allows QTAC to share your ATAR with other State Tertiary Application Centres. [Register for the ATAR Portal here.](#)

Student Portal - Year 12 registration

The [myQCE Student Portal](#) keeps your learning information in one place. Register using your LUI and a personal email address—*not your school email*. You can:

- Check and update your personal details
- View subjects, courses, VET qualifications and final Year 12 results
- Complete the QCAA academic integrity course and download your certificate

Make sure you register so you can access your QCE results.

What qualifications will I get at the end of Year 12?

On 16 December 2026, you will be able to log into your [QCAA Student Portal](#) to see your final subject results located in your learning account. If eligible, you will be issued with a senior education profile. Included in this profile could be:

- Senior Statement - this is a transcript of your learning account. The Senior Statement shows all QCE contributing studies and the results achieved that may contribute to the award of a Queensland Certificate of Education. If you receive a Senior Statement, then you have satisfied the completion requirements for Year 12 in Queensland.
- [Queensland Certificate of Education \(QCE\)](#) - The QCE is Queensland's senior school qualification and is awarded to eligible students, usually at the end of Year 12.
- [Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement \(QCIA\)](#) - The Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) recognises the achievements of students who are on individualised learning programs.

Study Skills and Wellbeing



How to retain information

German psychologist Hermann Ebbinghaus found that we forget new information quickly, especially in the first few hours. This is called the **forgetting curve**. Two ways to remember more are:

- **Memory tricks:** Use songs, images, connections or mnemonics such as ROY G BIV for the colours of the rainbow.
- **Spaced practice and active recall:** Review information the next day, a week later and again after a few weeks. Test yourself each time instead of just rereading your notes.

Regular revision over several weeks works better than cramming the night before an exam. [Learn more about the forgetting curve.](#)
