#### Looking at the Readings

Two weeks ago the Gospel from Matthew mentioned "Church". It is the only time in all the Gospels that this term is used. Today's passage offers three implications of the charisms of the Church. Firstly it has the duty to correct faults and bring its members to repentance; secondly it has the authority to maintain order and discipline and to judge in the Lord's name. Thirdly it is a community of believers, gathering to pray which, in a way, constitutes the presence as God's people in the world.

The Reading from Prophet Ezekiel gives the same duty to the believer: to call a sinner to repentance. But the Lord adds two warnings on the failure to act and the refusal to respond.

Superficially one may see that the community, the present day Church, as an organisation that has rules and protocols for behaviour, a code of conduct, judicial procedures, structures of leadership, hierarchy and the like. But there underlies in Christ's teaching the need for charity and forgiveness and the sense of fraternal care and wellbeing. The passages also speak of the power of prayer and pastoral authority. St Paul throws another light onto duties and commandments: "You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour and answers every one of the commandment" (Rom 13:10).

#### **Season of Creation**

Season of Creation began on 1 September (first day of Spring) and concludes on 4 October (Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the author of the Canticle of the Creatures [or the Sun]). Christians around the world are praying and caring for creation.

#### Prayer for the Day (excerpt from Canticle of the Sun)

Praised be You, my Lord, with all Your creatures, especially Brother Sun, who is the day and through whom You give us light. Praised be You, my Lord, through Sister Moon and the stars, in heaven You formed them clear and precious and beautiful.

#### Pope Francis on the Season of Creation 2023

God wants everyone to strive to be just in every situation, to live according to his laws and thus to enable life to flourish. When we "seek first the kingdom of God" (*Mt* 6:33), maintaining a right relationship with God, humanity and nature, then justice and peace can flow like a never-failing stream of pure water, nourishing humanity and all creatures.

# **Liturgical Jottings**Eucharistic Prayer part 2

The Eucharist Prayer consists of seven distinct elements and three acclamations. This week we look at the first: "The Thanksgiving".

Thanksgiving (expressed especially in the Preface), in which the Priest, in the name of the whole of the holy people, glorifies God the Father and gives thanks to him for the whole work of salvation or for some particular aspect of it, according to the varying day, festivity, or time of year. GIRM 79. Moreover we praise and give thanks for the marvelous works of God especially those of Jesus Christ. It is well expressed in the Second Eucharistic Prayer:

"Your Word through whom you made all things, whom you sent as our Saviour and Redeemer, incarnate by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin. Fulfilling your will and gaining for you a holy people, he stretched out his hands as he endured his Passion, so as to break the bonds of death and manifest the resurrection."

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#### REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

The offering of forgiveness to a sister, brother or one we know where forgiveness is restoring a relationship as one of the more painful ways in taking up our personal crosses, following Jesus' desire for a more harmonious life. The gospel reading forms this desire and the process of forgiveness being carried through. Over the course of my personal reading and reflection a word I have encountered is referred to as 'SUBSIDIARITY'. It sounds technical! Simply the word means... "One does not do something at a higher level when it can be done at a lower, in contrast to starting at the top with the highest authority". So, an approach in reconciliation is to be the one-to-one conversation between the offended one and the offender. These days there has been a great shift in understanding when the community is seen as being offended. Meaning the two or three gathered is in itself... community!

Over the past weeks Pope Francis has declared the Church today is seen where all are welcomed. As I write this Pope Francis is in Mongolia in a country where Catholic numbers are around 1500. It's a first Papal visit to this country. It's indicative of Pope Francis' approach of going out to the marginalised, the small, and as he said at the Mass..." God loves to use what is little to achieve great things." He went on to say. "All of us are God's nomads, pilgrims in search of happiness, wayfarers thirsting for love". This I see as a way giving us direction seeing moments in life and faith where we can give a restoration to our place and all we bring to our Church life here at St. Mel's.

So, no matter how small or great difficulties we encounter, a pathway for us to see in our prayer and personal moments of reflection, give rise to seeing our place in bringing reconciliation and healing to another. It's been a firm belief of mine for the Church to be authentic in proclaiming the gospel also needs this being seen out in the world. At a time where many feel alienated or not wanting the Church, ours is an opportunity through Pope Francis' desire to be a community of disciples who see others for what they bring of themselves to our community in faith.

#### First Reading: A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus

Forgive your neighbour's faults and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven.

Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner.

He who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord, who keeps strict account of sin.

Forgive your neighbour the hurt he does you, and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven.

If a man nurses anger against another, can he then demand compassion from the Lord?

Showing no pity for a man like himself, can he then plead for his own sins?

Mere creature of flesh, he cherishes resentment; who will forgive him his sins?

Remember the last things, and stop hating, remember dissolution and death, and live by the commandments.

Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour ill-will; remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook the offence.

Response: The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger and rich in compassion.

#### **Second Reading:** A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Whether alive or dead, we belong to the Lord.

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life, it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.
