In completing the requirements for the Scout Medallion Award, SCARLETT GRINTER has undertaken the following:

CAMPCRAFT BADGE:

Acquire and demonstrate competence in: selection, use and care of equipment for both standing and light weight camps; use of ropes; safety and regulatory aspects of fires and cooking appliances in the outdoors; safety and survival in the outdoors, including bushfire survival; advanced navigation in the field with and without the use of map and compass; and, cooking in the outdoors including construction of a balanced menu and the use of light-weight foods suitable for expeditions; Undertake an expedition into unfamiliar terrain requiring two nights out of doors. Extensive practical camping experience.

CITIZENSHIP BADGE:

Acquire and demonstrate competence in: first aid and the management of emergency situations; the Australian heritage; international affairs; provision of emergency and other community services; environmental awareness and responsibility; and, personal health, fitness and safety. Contribute at least ten hours of service towards worthwhile community activities. Plan and conduct activities enabling other Scouts to learn about leadership and teamwork. Demonstrate an understanding of core Scout Association values of duty to ones god country, service to others and responsible citizenship and spiritual development.

EMERGENCIES BADGE:

Acquire and demonstrate competence in the leadership of a small team in managing a variety of emergency situations.

Acquire and demonstrate a range of advanced first aid competencies (beyond those gained under the Citizenship Badge above).

Acquire and demonstrate specific emergency management competencies relevant to range of situations. Teach other Scouts about emergency situations and their management.

DEVELOPMENT OF SPECIALIST INTERESTS:

Actively extend a range of specialist hobbies, pursuits and interests by active investigation of the subject, acquisition of new or enhanced skills and undertaking specific activities in the following areas:

Abseiling, Animal Keeper, Fire Awareness, Individual Sportsman, Outdoor, Team Sports, Top Rope Climbing, World Scouting; each area requiring in general not less than ten hours' effort.

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT:

Acquire and demonstrate significant personal development in leadership through participation in a Scout Leadership Course and the practical leadership of a small group (Patrol) of Scouts. Undertake active leadership responsibilities designed to enhance the Scout Troop through membership of the Troop Council, responsible for broad program planning and Troop policies, operations and management.

FIRST AID:

In addition to First Aid training completed under areas of the formal Award Scheme above, develop enhanced First Aid competencies through completing an externally accredited formal First Aid qualification.
