ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

- Continue to build reading stamina
- Use comprehension strategies to understand and discuss texts listened to, viewed or read independently
- Continue to identify some features of texts including events and characters and retell events from a text
- Recognise that texts are created by authors who tell stories and share experiences that may be similar or different to students' own experiences
- Blend sounds associated with letters when reading consonant-vowel-consonant words
- Read texts with familiar structures and features, practising phrasing and fluency, and monitor meaning using concepts about print and emerging phonic, semantic, contextual and grammatical knowledge

Writing

- Write short texts to explore, record and report ideas events using familiar words and beginning writing knowledge
- Retell familiar literary texts through performance, use of illustrations and images
- Understand that spoken sounds and words can be written and know how to write some high-frequency words and other familiar words including their name
- Understand that punctuation is a feature of the written text different from letters and recognise how capital letters are used for names, and that capital letters and full stops signal the beginning and end of sentences
- Participate in shared editing of students' own texts for meaning, spelling, capital letters and full stops

Speaking and Listening

- Continue 'Speaking and Listening Timetable
- Actively engages informal discussions
- Shares ideas through class, group and pair discussions
- Participate in the musical 'Mary Poppins'

- Ask questions to clarify understanding -Who, What, Where, When, Why and How
- Responds to others opinions using polite statements
- Delivers short oral presentations using voice levels, gestures and eye contact

Learning and Teaching Statement: We believe that through the lens of 'Our Creative Selves' that students will have opportunities to think imaginatively, communicate confidently and express themselves in creative ways. Through the Arts and all aspects of English, students should see themselves as 'artist and audience'.

Students should be provoked and challenged in their thinking which helps them learn to: analyse, understand and build relationships with others and with the world around them. Students will be taught different ways of thinking, and will hopefully build their self-awareness and their capacity for reflection. This enables students to develop an increasingly sophisticated understanding of the processes they can employ whenever they encounter both the familiar and unfamiliar, to break ineffective habits and build on successful ones.

 Learning activities across the curriculum are differentiated to cater for the needs of all students.

HOME LEARNING

All students are encouraged to read for 10 minutes each night.

Revise sight words and identify sight words in books.

Children need to have developed quick, automatic recall of their sight words.
