Hit 'submit' on your Educational Access Scheme application

17 December deadline reminder

The Educational Access Scheme aims to help UAC applicants who have experienced significant educational disadvantage receive an offer to university.

There are close to 30 specific types of disadvantage that universities will take into consideration when assessing your application for entry into a course. These disadvantages fall under broad groups such as financial hardship, illness or disability, disrupted schooling, severe family disruption, and excessive family responsibilities. You'll need to provide supporting documentation for each disadvantage you claim.

If you are hoping for an offer in January Round 2 on 26 January, and want to know if you are eligible for EAS before then, you need to submit your application and upload your supporting documents by midnight on 17 December.

UCAT Universities for ANZ 2022 Details

The details below will be confirmed by January 2022.

The UCAT ANZ is a compulsory entry requirement for our Australia and New Zealand Consortium universities. You are required to sit the UCAT ANZ 2022 test (between 1 July and 12 August 2022) if you are intending to apply for entry in 2023 to a relevant course or programme listed below. UCAT ANZ results cannot be carried over from one year to the next. For example, results from UCAT ANZ 2022 can only be used to apply for courses commencing in 2023. Some pathways to medicine/dentistry/clinical sciences will not require the UCAT ANZ. For some applicants a different test may be required. You should always check the entry requirements for each course or programme using the websites of the universities to which you intend to apply before booking a test.

There are no general exemptions from the test.

The top universities for architecture in 2021

Architecture is one of the most influential professions in society. It's a fascinating field that blends art, culture, science, technology and even elements of business.

There are two types of architecture degrees in Australia: a five-year version and a two-part version that begins with an undergraduate 'pre-professional qualification' in architecture, arts, applied science,

design or environmental design with an architecture major, followed by a two- or three-year specialist qualification in architecture.

Both qualifications must be followed by two years of practical experience and a further exam before being able to register to practise. Whichever route is chosen, students cover everything from engineering, structural design, building and project management to graphics and design. For those who'd like to study even more widely, it's worth considering a double degree — perhaps combining architecture with construction, landscape architecture, engineering or even law. Most architecture courses require at least some competence in mathematics, and most allow full-time study only.

The increasing profile of niche trading sectors such as ecotourism, cultural tourism, wine tourism and sport tourism has created growth in the industry, and new markets continue to emerge, including heritage tourism and Indigenous tourism.

Courses in this field are largely vocationally oriented, so many require students to work in on-campus training facilities and include compulsory periods of industry placement — often paid.

While some engineering specialisations focus on a certain type of technology — automotive, aerospace, biomedical, marine or telecommunications — others are concerned with adapting certain base elements, such as chemical, electrical, materials and mechanical.

Another type of specialisation concentrates on harvesting, developing and sustaining natural resources, such as agricultural, environmental and mining. The newer engineering fields — aeronautics, informatics and mechatronics — have risen in popularity in recent years.

Does a high-ATAR course guarantee the best employment outcomes?

It's well known that high-achieving students tend to gravitate toward courses with high ATAR requirements. But when looking at graduate outcomes, such as employment or a high starting salary, these courses don't necessarily deliver the best outcomes — at least not straight away.

Students habitually choose courses with the highest entry requirement they can access with their ATAR. In theory, the higher the ATAR, the better the course, and the better the employment outcome.

In 2020–2021, a degree in [Social Work](#) had an average ATAR requirement of 71, making it relatively accessible. However, the median starting salary for graduates of Social Work was among the highest of all fields of study — \$65,400*. In contrast, the average ATAR cut-off for [Law](#) students is 87, and the median graduate starting salary is \$62,000.

The salaries of NSW public school leaders reflect the increased levels of responsibility. Assistant principals and head teachers, for example, earn a minimum of \$124,038 and deputy principals earn a minimum of \$144,822. A principal of a large high school earns up to \$185,242 while an Executive Principal of a [Connected Communities](#) school earns a minimum of \$204,697 (current as of 01 February 2021).
