Australian Taxation Office Applying for a Tax File Number (TFN)

Any student will need at tax file number if he/she <u>starts work</u> (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they <u>cannot</u> enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Support Place) course at university without a Tax File Number, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early!

Students must apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

Commencing in 2025 a *new* major <u>Business Analytics</u> has been approved for the Bachelor of Commerce and will be available as a standalone and concurrent major.

Business analytics is the practice of using data, statistical analysis, and quantitative methods to gain insights into business performance and drive decision-making. It involves examining historical data, predicting future trends, and providing actionable recommendations to improve business outcomes.

What is a Freelance Journalist?

A freelance journalist is a writer who is self-employed. They complete contract work, single pieces or regular assignments for newspapers, magazines, companies, and other organizations.

They often sell their services or work by the piece, by the hour or by the day—sometimes freelance journalists even sell their work by the word. In other words, a freelance journalist is not committed to one employer long-term and works independently.

Career as an Anthropologist

According to the Good Universities Career Guide, <u>anthropologists</u> study the origin, development and functioning of human societies and cultures, as they exist now or have existed throughout history. Anthropologists are concerned with the complexities of social and cultural life, including religion, rituals, family and kinship systems, languages, art, music, symbolism, and economic and political systems.

Successful anthropologists -

- Have the capacity for detailed observation and accurate practical work
- Can work independently
- Have enthusiasm for research
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Sensitive to other people and cultures.

To become an anthropologist, students usually have to complete a degree in *science*, *arts*, *social science* or *international studies* at university with a major in anthropology (preferably at honours level), followed by a postgraduate qualification in anthropology.

<u>Bachelor of Arts and Entertainment Management</u> – a 3-year course for anyone wanting to master the essentials of the music business – from marketing and artist management to music


business economics and law.

They will build the skills to command the stage with confidence, building the 'triple skill set' – singing, dancing and acting.
