Students have also formed strong opinions about a range of topics, allowing them to create strong persuasive writing pieces, focusing on the structure of this type of writing and the techniques we can use to persuade our audience.

MATHS

This term in Maths, students have been working hard to grow their knowledge of Fractions and Multiplication.

Our Fractions work has seen students explore skills such as modelling fractions in a variety of ways and placing fractions on a number line.

In our Multiplication work, students have learnt about the *Power of 10* and how to use this to solve multiplication problems with a range of strategies.

Term 4 has been full of adventure and growth! At the Melbourne Zoo, students explored the connections between people, animals, and their environments. Camp strengthened teamwork, resilience, and inclusion, while the swimming program built confidence, refined movement skills, and promoted water safety!
