Show working for all Mathematics tasks and write **full sentences for written responses.**

Some tasks may feel challenging. The grid is designed to provide choice across different strengths and interests.

Parents and carers are encouraged to modify the amount of work to suit their child. You may reduce, increase or repeat activities according to the areas in which you would like to see more practice.

The focused Parent check and correct section identifies the specific part of each task that an adult should review with the student. Please help the student notice and correct errors rather than simply supplying the answer.

The Reading Log needs to be completed EVERY day.

Independent Reading Evidence Response Read for at least 20 minutes. Record 3 important details, 2 inferences and 1 short quotation. Write 80-100 words explaining what the section reveals about a character, idea or problem. Parent check and correct: quotation copied accurately; each inference is supported by a detail from the text. Curriculum: VC2E6LY08, VC2E6LE02	Setting Description Write 150 words describing an unusual place. Organise the description so the reader moves through the setting. Include precise nouns, strong verbs, sensory details and one simile or metaphor. Parent check and correct: paragraphs are organised; repeated or vague words are replaced; punctuation is corrected. Curriculum: VC2E6LY09, VC2E6LA08	Integer Number-Line Revision Draw a number line from -20 to 20. Plot and label 12 integers. Order them from least to greatest, then show the answers to 8 changes such as $-4 + 7$, $6 - 10$ and a temperature rising or falling. Parent check and correct: integers are placed on the correct side of zero; signs and final answers are corrected. Curriculum: VC2M6N01	Two-Week Practice Plan Choose the activities you will complete and make a simple two-week schedule. Include reading, homework, rest and one catch-up time. Estimate the minutes and adjust the plan after Week 2 if needed. Parent check and correct: the plan is realistic; completed tasks are ticked; one useful adjustment is recorded. Curriculum: VC2TDE6D05, VC2HC6S05
Two-Text Comparison Choose two short texts about the same topic, such as a news article and an information page. Create a table comparing purpose, main ideas, evidence, images and reliability. Finish with 3 sentences explaining which text is more useful and why. Parent check and correct: both texts are named; comparisons use evidence rather than preference alone. Curriculum: VC2E6LY07, VC2E6LY08	Sentence Combining Turn 10 pairs of short sentences into 10 fluent complex sentences. Use a mix of conjunctions, embedded clauses and introductory phrases. Underline the joining words and circle commas. Parent check and correct: each sentence is complete; commas are correctly placed; meaning has not changed. Curriculum: VC2E6LA05, VC2E6LA09	Integer Story Problems [Challenge] Write and solve 6 short problems using integers in contexts such as temperature, lifts, money owed, altitude or game scores. At least 2 problems must cross zero. Parent check and correct: each calculation matches the story; crossing zero is shown clearly on a number line. Curriculum: VC2M6N01	Family Interview and Reflection Interview an adult about a skill they had to practise to improve. Record 5 key points, then write 5-6 sentences explaining what their experience teaches you about persistence and feedback. Parent check and correct: notes reflect the adult's ideas; reflection uses complete sentences and a specific example. Curriculum: VC2HP6P04, VC2E6LY07
Author's Craft Hunt From your reading, find 4 examples of effective author choices: a strong verb, vivid description, figurative language and a sentence that builds tension or interest. Copy each example and explain its effect. Parent check and correct: examples are copied correctly; explanations say how each choice affects the reader. Curriculum: VC2E6LE02, VC2E6LA08	Persuasive Letter Write a 150-word letter persuading a teacher or family member to support a realistic change. Include a clear position, 3 reasons, supporting detail and a respectful conclusion. Parent check and correct: each reason has supporting detail; spelling and paragraphing are corrected. Curriculum: VC2E6LY09, VC2E6LA04	Rectangle Property Detective Draw 6 quadrilaterals, including at least 3 different rectangles. Label parallel sides, equal sides, right angles and lines of symmetry. Write 4 true statements explaining how squares and rectangles are related. Parent check and correct: labels are accurate; statements distinguish properties that are always true from those sometimes true. Curriculum: VC2M6SP01, VC2M6M02	Digital Organisation Reset Organise one school-related space: homework book, desk, device folders or school bag. Write a before-and-after checklist and 5 rules that will help you maintain it for two weeks. Parent check and correct: checklist is completed honestly; rules are specific and practical. Curriculum: VC2TDI6D06, VC2TDE6D05
Vocabulary in Context [Challenge] Select 8 unfamiliar or interesting words from reading. For each, write the sentence, infer a meaning from context, check the meaning, then write a new sentence of your own. Parent check and correct: meanings fit the original sentence; new sentences show the word used correctly. Curriculum: VC2E6LY06, VC2E6LA08	Editing Detective [Challenge] Write a paragraph of 100-120 words, then edit it in a different colour. Make at least 10 purposeful corrections or improvements involving spelling, punctuation, sentence structure or vocabulary. Add a brief note explaining your 3 best edits. Parent check and correct: at least 10 genuine edits are visible; corrections improve accuracy or clarity. Curriculum: VC2E6LY10, VC2E6LA05, VC2E6LA09	Rectangle Fluency Challenge [Challenge] Complete: 20 multiplication/division facts; 6 rectangle area or perimeter questions; and 3 missing-side questions. Create your own final rectangle problem with an answer. Show efficient working. Parent check and correct: facts are corrected; units are included; area and perimeter are not confused. Curriculum: VC2M6N09, VC2M6M02	Movement and Wellbeing Check Complete 20-30 minutes of physical activity on 3 different days. Record the activity, duration and effort. Write a short reflection comparing your mood, energy and focus before and after. Parent check and correct: three entries are complete; reflection compares before and after using specific details. Curriculum: VC2HP6M01, VC2HP6P10
