Play - hand roll Learn - head tap Grow - hand stack



We pay our respects to the Elders past, present and emerging and recognise those who continue to protect and promote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures.

Past - Thumbs back over shoulder
Present - small sweep with hand outwards
Emerging - Hands pointed forwards
Protect - Hands crossed over chest
Culture - one hand tap heart



We will care for the **land**, **sky** and **waterways**.

We will protect the animals and plants from the **tops of the trees** to the **roots of the earth**.

Land - hand/arm sweep low Sky - Hand/arm sweep high Waterways - hands together and waves Tops of the trees - Tinkle fingers up high Roots of the Earth - Hands flat down low

Learning Journey - Hands/arms crossed around waists Together - Open arms wide

All: Amen.



Lord, hear us.





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
Bridging Now to Next






