LANGUAGES - GREEK FLMD (First Language Maintenance & Development program)

SEMESTER 2

The students will continue to work with verb groups in particular Group 4 verbs (verbs that end in $-\mu\alpha$). This will enable them to use different groups of verbs to create a variety of sentences with the aid of <u>Sentence Wheels</u> and <u>Story Dice</u>.

<u>YEAR 5/6</u>

The students will listen to, read and view a short story and will respond by expressing feelings and opinions about the storyline and characters. They will describe character and qualities by identifying and using **adjectives**. Furthermore, they will participate in shared activities to create their own short story using modelled language.

Furthermore, the students will listen to one of <u>Aesop's fables</u> and respond to questions about characters, themes and events. They will discuss key messages in the text such as the moral of the fable or a quality of character.

<u>YEAR 6/7</u>

Students will be introduced to **Karagiozis**, a shadow puppet and fictional character of Greek folklore. They will listen to, read and view various multimodal texts and respond by expressing ideas and opinions about the story line and characters. They will participate in role-plays and create their own texts using familiar language associated with Karagiozis.

In addition, the students will undertake a shared task which will involve planning, collaborating and researching information about festivals in Greece or Greek Festivals held abroad. They will present their information in a creative way such as a poster, brochure or advertisement to share with the community at the **Glendi** Greek festival later in the year.

ORAL LANGUAGE

Year 5/6 - In order to develop their speaking and listening skills the students will present a simple oral such as a Greek joke/riddle, song, poem, proverb or tongue twister.

Year 6/7 – The students will prepare and give a short, simple talk on a choice of topics provided in order to help build their confidence in using the Greek language.
