

NAPLAN - Students by Proficiency Levels 1





What is PhOrMeS?

PhOrMeS has been created in order to provide schools with high-quality literacy curriculum materials that cover decoding, spelling and vocabulary. It is informed by both the Science of Reading and is a systematic, synthetic phonics curriculum.

- Ph Phonology The teaching of sound / letter
 correspondences
- Or Orthography Teaching spelling rules and
 patterns
- M Morphology The study of the smallest parts within words. e.g. the suffix, prefix, base word and root word.
- e- Etymology The study of the origin of words
- S Semantics The meaning of a word / sense



Each lesson starts with a Daily Review where we revise phonics and spelling rules. Students revise the rule, read the words and then practise the rule by writing the words on the whiteboard, or in their book.

We then look at 'Weird Words', where we teach irregular words.

After the review we focus on new spelling rules and patterns.


