CELEBRATING 150 YEARS ST PAUL'S CHURCH IS ESTABLISHED AT PENTRIDGE

Arriving in 1848 at the age of 36, Bishop James Goold was appointed as the first Catholic bishop for Melbourne. He immediately set to work overseeing the construction of church buildings for the ever-increasing Catholic population of Melbourne. By 1850, the foundation stone for St Paul's church in Pentridge (later named Coburg) had been laid. The first priest appointed to this new



mission was **Fr Patrick Dunne** who had arrived from Ireland that same year. Fr Dunne's mission extended from the Brunswick area into the far north of the diocese. He also acted as chaplain to the infamous Pentridge Prison. By then, gold had been discovered in Victoria and the builder abandoned a half-built St Paul's church to try his luck on the goldfields. So, for some time, Mass was held in either the roofless church or a marquee on the site, depending on the weather. It was not until 1855 that the first St Paul's church was finally finished and dedicated by Bishop Goold.



Taking over from Fr Patrick Dunne, Fr Charles O'Hea arrived in Coburg in 1853 from Ireland. The Catholics of Brunswick continued to attend Mass at their parish of St Paul's in Coburg. Fr O'Hea served the parishioners of the area for almost 30 years, as well as being chaplain to the prison. He was well known for his charitable works and dedication to his people. To show the esteem in which he was held, a street near St Paul's church has been named after him. As we will soon see, Fr Charles O'Hea was instrumental in establishing St Ambrose's church in Brunswick.

Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

Communion Antiphon

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, says the Lord, and I will raise him up on the last day.

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The readings highlight two different but related themes: the character of our understanding of Christ, and our understanding of discipleship that flows from it. Christological reflections reach a climax in the question posed to the disciples: Who do you say I am? In this liturgical context, the same question is posed to us. Who is this one who multiplies loaves of bread, who walks on turbulent waters, who breaks the boundaries that separate insider from outsider? It is none other than the messiah. When Peter testified to Jesus' identity, it was a relevant religious and political statement, for messianic expectation was a burning question at that time. But what does it mean for the average Christian today? Many believers consider messianic expectation a theological theme that belongs to the past. They feel that it is difficult to get excited about the coming of someone who we believe has already come and gone. If Jesus were to pose this question today, how would we answer?

Like Peter, we too may have good intentions, but when they are put to the test we realise that that was all that they were – good intentions. Still, we should not be discouraged by our weaknesses, for just as Peter's failure did not deter God from entrusting him with power and authority, so our failures need not be obstacles to God's grace in our lives. We watch God entrust the church to individuals who are weak and undependable, and we realise that judgments are inscrutable and God's ways unsearchable.


