#### PROGRESS REPORTS INFORMATION GUIDE

#### An Update on Your Child's Learning



**Progress Reports** form part of Bemin Secondary College's assessment and reporting cycle each year. They provide a meaningful opportunity for teachers to update families on how each student is progressing academically and with their behaviour in each class.

#### What do they look like?

Your child will be assessed on six key areas: Tracking towards the Victorian Curriculum standard, Learning Growth, Organising Classwork, Homework, Follows Expected Classroom Routines, and Respect.

They will receive a statement for each area of assessment, corresponding to the levels explained in detail on the *Understanding* the *Progress Report rubric* overleaf. Your child's progress report will look similar to the example below, and using the attached rubric, your child's next steps to achieving the next level are evident.
