Exceeding or Strong students in 2024 (%) For students in Year 5, Reading





#### Australia's performance over time


Mean scores for Science, Reading and Mathematics has declined






### Rhetorical question as general statement



Rhetorical questions can be used to open persuasive texts.

They can **take the place** of the **general statement** in your introductory paragraph.

Rhetorical questions make people think about a topic. They are often used for dramatic or persuasive effect. Have you ever wondered where your family comes from or how knowing your ancestors' stories could change your life? Exploring your family history is more than just discovering names and dates; it's about uncovering the legacy that shapes who you are today. Researching your family's past boosts your emotional wellbeing, strengthens your connections with relatives, and ensures that valuable cultural traditions are preserved for future generations.

Choral response - students give the answer verbally in unison



Mini-whiteboard - students write their answer on a mini-whiteboard before showing it to the teacher.



Pair share - Students discuss with the person next to them.

### **Key principles**

The **I do** phase involves the explanation indicates where a teacher would be explaining and modelling a concept.



Moving from I do to We do involves guided practice - moving from teacher-led instruction to student-led practice.



Check for Understanding - Formative instruction questions, posed to check whether students have understood and to inform next instructional steps.



You do - Practice - indicates places where students will attempt questions independently.


