Hi All

When a group of career practitioners met for breakfast on 9 September, the lack of work readiness displayed by school students emerged as a key issue.

It's not a new issue. My Mum and Dad complained about their young staff in the 60's. When I started teaching in Geraldton in the late 70's, I remember defending school students by telling critics that story about Mum and Dad.

Just because it is a persistent problem doesn't mean we don't need to do something about it.

In his annual presentation to career advisors, Labor Market Statistician Ivan Neville identified that *Employers say that they will teach new employees' technical skills, but they need the kids to show up, on time and be interested.*

Then I heard a talk on <u>ABC The Money by Lisa Fowkes</u>, Director of Employment, Social Ventures Australia, who said that employers can teach skills but they need employees who have practical employability skills learned in authentic environments.





Steve Motion from **Barminco** recommends:

- Get a manual driver's license if you want to work in mining. •
- Have an appropriate email address. Don't put your school email address if you are about to leave school and *sexyquy@qmail.com* is not going to impress a potential employer.
- If you change your phone number, let the potential employer know by email and by ringing them.
- Dress neatly for interviews.
- It's ok to be nervous.
- Research the business you want to work for. If you want them to be interested in • employing you, you need to show you are interested in working for them.
- Don't be afraid to ask for feedback. This will help you in your next application and if another job comes up with this employer, they may remember you. (Ask for two things you did well in your application and one thing you can improve on. Bev)

Unique Student Identifier



Students who have already been studying a VET subject will have a Unique Student Identifier. If you haven't got one and want to apply for Commonwealth assistance when you enrol at university next year you will need a to apply for one.

You need it to:

- Register for Commonwealth assistance (HECS-HELP, FEE-HELP, OS-HELP, SA-HELP)
- To receive your degree, certificate, diploma, certificate or record of achievement if you're graduating in 2023 or later

Your Unique Student Identifier will be used to maintain a record of your qualifications gained in Australia.

It is recommended students create or find their USI via <u>www.usi.gov.au</u> before they need it to apply for financial assistance.





Regional Traineeship Opportunities

A Regional Traineeship Program is now open to boost training, skills and employment opportunities across regional Western Australia. The \$2 million funding round is available to Community Resource Centres (CRCs) and eligible local government authorities (LGAs) to support trainees in regional areas. Grants of up to \$30,000 are available to go towards vocational training for local communities, based on business and industry needs. The grant is to provide a one-off payment to subsidise the cost of employing a trainee. It doesn't matter how smart you are, if you are rude, lazy or just not interested, you will not win the job.





A couple of years ago I suggested that insomniacs could find a cure by listening to a presentation by statistician, Ivan Neville!!


I listened, didn't fall sleep and am now a big fan, along with 650 others around Australia who tuned into his 2020 webinar on 9 September.

Ivan is a mild-mannered statistician turned superhero who has bravely gone where no statistician has gone before. He has given advice based on wildly changing information to guide us through this turbulent employment environment.



My main take away is that we need to beware of school leavers developing long term scarring through the environment that they are about to enter.

The Bad News



The impact on employment has been devastating with the greatest hit being on 15 – 24-year olds.

There are more than 0.5m more people unemployed than there were in March. Australia has over 1m people unemployed for the first time in history.


That doesn't include the thousands on Job Keeper who may be doing 0 hours, or the women who had to drop out of the labour market to look after kids who are home from school.




As the jobs market becomes more competitive as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, knowing what employers want is more important than ever.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

A qualification improves job prospects significantly

Unemployment rates, by highest level of education, 25-34 years, Australia



The pandemic has hit across the board BUT having the right qualifications is even more important in a more competitive labour market!

Students may leave school before getting their WACE, but they need to get a Certificate III or IV to significantly improve their job prospects.

The jobs market is becoming more highly skilled

- → Year 12 or equivalent is the minimum for many employers
- → Increasing numbers of jobs require post-school qualifications
- \rightarrow Lifelong learning is a must!
- → "Everyone else is doing it" the trend toward increasing educational attainment will continue

In 1999, **43.7%** of the working age population had post school qualifications – this increased to **62.4%** in 2019

90% of jobs are going to require a post school qualification.

EXPERIENCE



But how do students get experience when there are fewer jobs available?

If students can't get a part time job, they can demonstrate their employability skills via:

- Work experience
- **Sport** show leadership by coaching young kids or taking on responsibility for organising or cleaning.
- **Entrepreneurships** start a business. I know of students who have organised babysitting, cleaning, and gardening businesses among themselves.
- **Volunteering** check out opportunities through Seek. Look for the *volunteering* tab on the top. Or look for opportunities in your suburb through Google volunteers.

Employability

Employers want new employees to have employability skills. Employers say that they will teach new employees' technical skills, but they need the kids to show up, on time and be interested (and nice!!)

Apprenticeships Down in March Quarter compared to 2019

Latest national data shows apprentice and trainee commencements were down 11.0 per cent (to 49 015) in the March quarter 2020 when compared with the same quarter in 2019.

Apprentices and trainees 2020 — March quarter

<u>NCVER</u> Managing Director Simon Walker said that while the underlying March quarter data shows some early indicators of COVID-19's impact (particularly in the month of March), it won't be until the June quarter that we get a true sense of how the pandemic has affected apprenticeship and traineeship activity.

- "Numbers of those commencing apprenticeships or traineeships in trade occupations were down 9.8 per cent in the March quarter 2020, with the biggest decreases seen in food trades workers, down 20.4 per cent, and construction trades workers, down 13 per cent.
- "Commencements in non-trade occupations also showed a decrease, down 12.4 per cent compared with March quarter 2019, with the biggest declines seen in hospitality, retail and service managers, down 67.7 per cent, enquiry clerks and receptionists, down 41.5 per cent, and sales assistants and salespersons, down 29 per cent."

Overall, there were 272 505 apprentices and trainees in-training as at 31 March 2020, down 2.9 per cent from 31 March 2019. See the NCVER Report <u>HERE</u>.

In 2019, there were:

- 235 800 VET in Schools students
- 17 100 school-based apprentices and trainees, representing 7.3% of all VET in Schools students
- 218 700 students undertaking other VET in Schools programs, representing 92.7% of all VET in Schools students.

In 2019, compared with 2018, VET in Schools students increased by 2.2%.

From 2015 to 2019, VET in Schools students decreased by 8.3%.
