



Numeracy

We are revisiting the important mathematical skills of addition and subtraction over the coming weeks.

We began this learning with an open-ended task which asked students to look at a collection of dots and describe the amount by colour coding and using number sentences (equations). This reveals all the different ways one number can be seen and described. For example:





3+3+3+3 = 12 OR 6+2+4=12

Skill in Focus Articulation

Here at school we have a strong focus on teaching students how to articulate a range of consonant and vowel sounds. This involves exploring what our mouths look like when we create a sound and using cued articulation gestures to help prompt students to produce sounds.

A common sound mix-up that occurs is between the /th/ sound and /f/ sound. We always encourage students to take note of where their tongue is placed when making the sound. Knowing how our mouth looks when we make a sound helps with our reading and spelling.





Future Learning

Students will begin a new Content Knowledge unit on 'The Culture of Japan' in Week 7.
