- Who? Dr Prashima and Nurse Jo
- What? Free and confidential health care
- When? Every Thursday
- Where? Next to the Sickbay
- Why? So students can access health care at school



What can see the doctor for Scoresby Scores

- A general health check-up
- Injuries such as sports injuries
- Vision and hearing tests
- Asthma management
- Advice on healthy eating
- Help to quit smoking or vaping
- Mental health body image, depression, anxiety
- Sexual health contraception, STIs, pregnancy testing





Consistent with Australian common law, the program recognises that:

- Any student who wants to see the GP will be permitted to book an appointment.
- The GP will decide whether the young person is mature enough to consent to medical treatment or whether parent/carer consent is needed – as is the case with all GPs in the community.
- The right for a young person's health information to be kept confidential will be respected unless the disclosure is with the consent of the young person or it is otherwise permitted by law – as is the case with all GP practice in the community.

How to make an appointment Scoresby Secondary College Inspiring brilliance

Students can make an appointment to see the doctor by:

- 1. Going to see Tahlia Pastor (Student Services Leader) in the Student Services Office or Michele (Admin/First Aid) in the General Office.
- 2. Emailing: scoresby.sc@education.vic.gov.au
- 3. Dropping into see Nurse Jo during recess or lunchtime on

Thursdays when the clinic is open.

4. Going to see Head of Wellbeing /Assistant principal Ms DeBoer).
